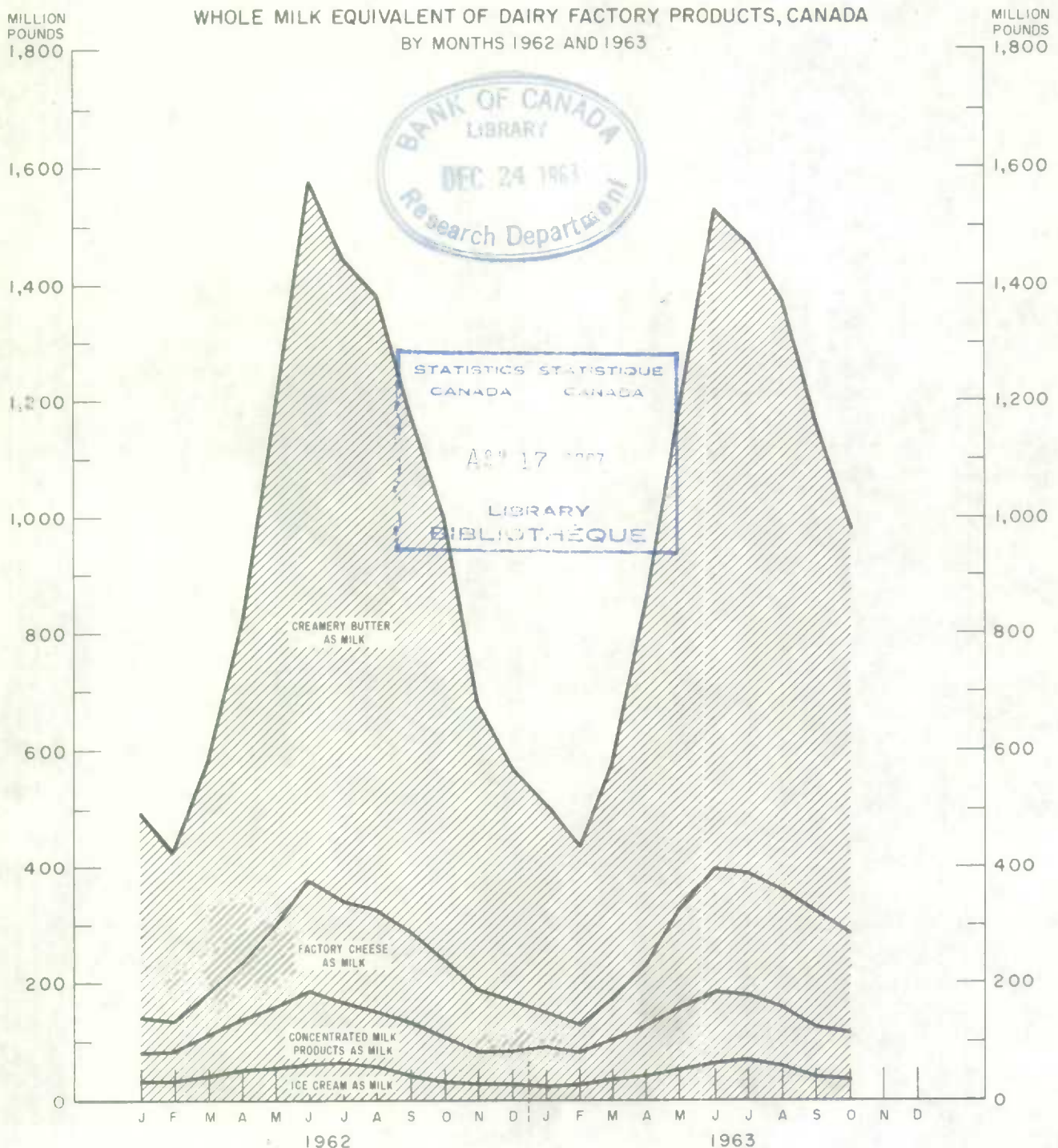


# THE DAIRY REVIEW

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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, November, 1963

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in November is 1,316,000,000 pounds. This is about the same as production in the corresponding month last year and would make the total estimate of production for the first eleven months of the year 18,061,000,000 pounds, practically unchanged from last year.

About 51 per cent of the milk produced in November, or 674,000,000 pounds was used for factory products. This represented a slight increase over factory utilization in November, 1962. Creamery butter production during the month used 473,000,000 pounds of milk, 4.2 per cent less than in November, 1962, while milk used in the manufacture of cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix increased 14.1, 7.2 and 11.8 per cent, respectively, over that of a year ago. During the January - November period, slightly less milk was used for dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1962.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in November, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 513,800,000 pounds. This is an increase of 3.0 per cent over fluid sales in November, 1962, and assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the month of October.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 1.0 per cent above that used in November, 1962, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 21.4 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report fewer milk cows kept on farms at November 15, and less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 3.2 per cent above the level at November 15, 1962. It should be noted that these sample indications are not necessarily representative of production conditions on all farms producing milk.

It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

### Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in October, 1963

**Farm Milk Production:** The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in October amounted to 1,636 million pounds, a decrease of 9 million pounds or 0.6 per cent below that of October, 1962. Of this amount, 979 million pounds or 60 per cent was utilized in factory production and approximately 522 million pounds or 32 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - October period, the estimated production was 16,745 million pounds, a decrease of 16 million pounds below that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - October period amounted to 10,072 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 5,046 million pounds.

**Fluid Sales:** Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 522 million pounds in October, an increase of approximately 15 million pounds in comparison with October of the previous year. This included about 439 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 27 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 83 million pounds representing 5 per cent. During the ten month period, fluid sales totalled 5,046 million pounds, an increase of 111 million pounds or 2.2 per cent over those of the corresponding 1962 period.

**Farm Butter:** Butter made on farms in October amounted to 399,000 pounds, decreasing 24 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962. For the January - October period, 4,249,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 26 per cent from the same period last year.

**Farm Cash Income:** Cash income from the sale of dairy products in October amounted to \$48,086,000. This represented an increase of 1.6 per cent or \$736,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.20 per hundred pounds of milk was 4 cents higher than in October, 1962. Fluid milk at \$4.84 per hundred was 4 cents higher than in October, 1962. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 68.5 cents to 67.7 cents per pound, and farm butter at 56 cents per pound was 2 cents lower than in October, 1962. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.83 per hundred, 7 cents higher than in October, 1962. Cheese milk increased to \$2.91 per hundred, an increase of 6 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

## Production and Prices of Dairy Products in October, 1963

### Creamery Butter

**Production:** Creamery butter production amounted to 29.7 million pounds in October, 1963, a decrease of approximately 2.8 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

**Stocks:** Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on November 1, 1963, amounted to 264.8 million pounds, approximately 4.3 million pounds higher than at November 1 last year. On October 1, 1963, stock holdings at 268.8 million pounds were 10.6 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

**Supply:** The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on October 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 298.5 million pounds of butter at October 31, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 7.8 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at October 31, 1962.

**Domestic Disappearance:** The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in October amounted to 28.1 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 2.1 million pounds or 6.9 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.50 pounds as compared with 1.63 pounds in October, 1962.

**Prices at Montreal:** Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 50  $\frac{3}{4}$  cents per pound in October, the same as in October, 1962.

### Cheddar Cheese

**Production:** Cheddar cheese production in October amounted to approximately 14.4 million pounds, an increase of 3.5 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

**Prices:** The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 38  $\frac{3}{8}$  cents per pound in October. The comparative price in 1962 was 37  $\frac{3}{4}$  cents.

### Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in October was approximately 1.6 million gallons or 219 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
