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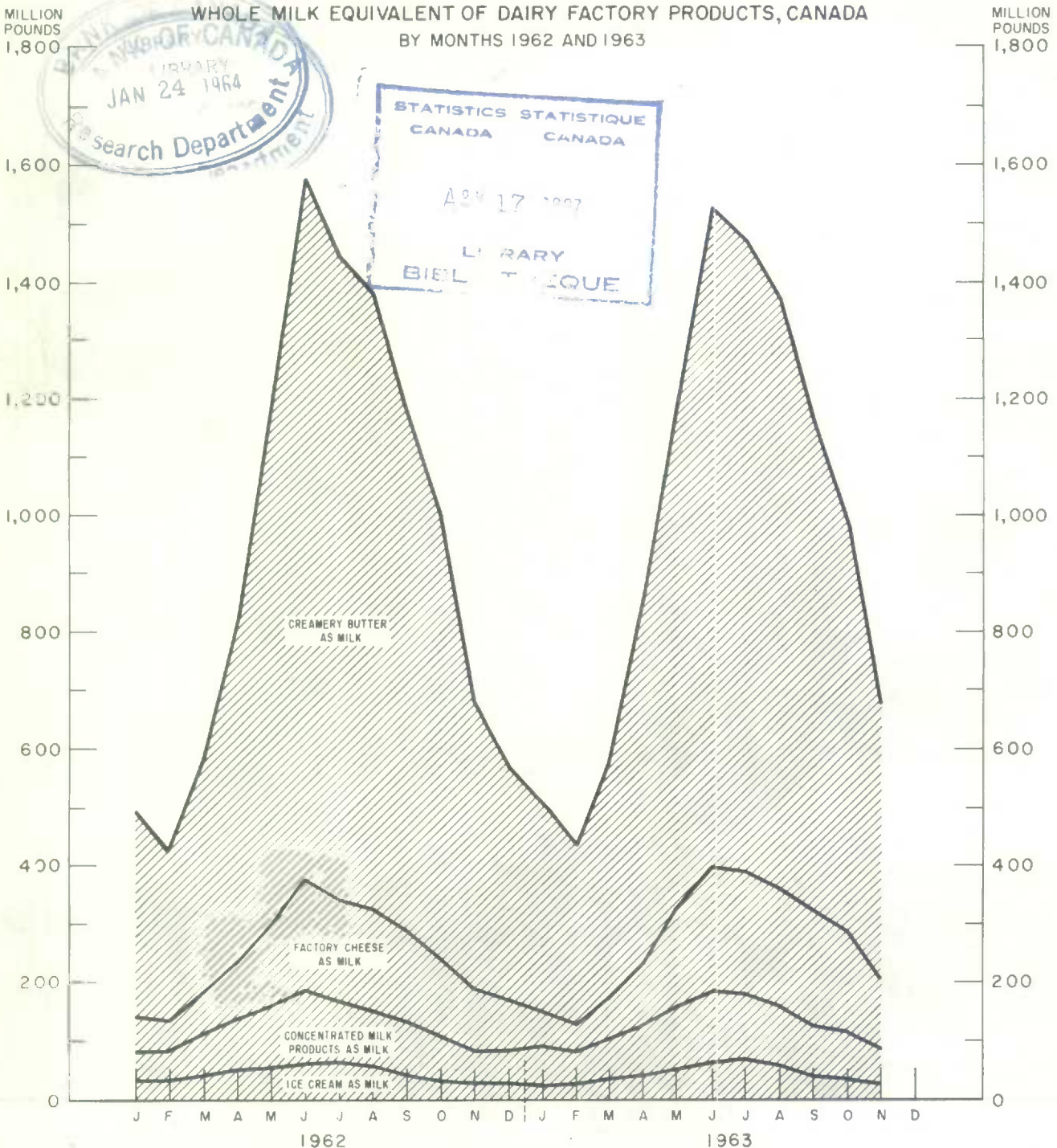

THE DAIRY REVIEW

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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, December, 1963

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in December is 1,242,000,000 pounds. This is 1.4 per cent higher than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production for the year 19,309,000,000 pounds, practically unchanged from last year.

About 46 per cent of the milk produced in December, or 577,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 2.3 per cent greater than factory utilization in December, 1962. Creamery butter production during the month accounted for 399,000,000 pounds of milk, slightly more than in December, 1962, while milk used in the manufacture of cheese and concentrated whole milk products increased 7.8 and 8.9 per cent, respectively, over that of a year ago. December milk utilization for ice cream mix, however, was 2.8 per cent below that of a year ago. During the January to December period, slightly less milk was used for dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1962.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in December, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 530,100,000 pounds. This is an increase of 2.8 per cent over fluid sales in December, 1962, and assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the September-November period.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 2.9 per cent above that used in December, 1962, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 18.0 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey report slightly fewer cows kept on farms at December 15, and 1.2 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year.

It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

### Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in November, 1963

**Farm Milk Production:** The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in November amounted to 1,322 million pounds, an increase of 22 million pounds or 1.7 per cent over that of November, 1962. Of this amount, 674 million pounds or 51 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 519 million pounds or 39 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - November period, the estimated production was 18,966 million pounds, an increase of 6 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - November period amounted to 10,746 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 5,565 million pounds.

**Fluid Sales:** Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 519 million pounds in November, an increase of approximately 20 million pounds in comparison with November of the previous year. This included about 436 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 33 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 83 million pounds representing 6 per cent. During the eleven month period, fluid sales totalled 5,565 million pounds, an increase of 131 million pounds or 2.4 per cent over those of the corresponding 1962 period.

**Farm Butter:** Butter made on farms in November amounted to 368,000 pounds, decreasing 22 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962. For the January - November period, 4,617,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 26 per cent from the same period last year.

**Farm Cash Income:** Cash income from the sale of dairy products in November amounted to \$40,667,000. This represented an increase of 4.5 per cent or \$1,751,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.41 per hundred pounds of milk was 5 cents higher than in November, 1962. Fluid milk at \$4.86 per hundred was 5 cents higher than in November, 1962. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 68.7 cents to 68.2 cents per pound, and farm butter at 56 cents per pound was 1 cent lower than in November, 1962. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.91 per hundred, 9 cents higher than in November, 1962. Cheese milk increased to \$2.95 per hundred, an increase of 9 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

### Production and Prices of Dairy Products in November, 1963

#### Creamery Butter

**Production:** Creamery butter production amounted to 20.2 million pounds in November, 1963, a decrease of approximately 0.9 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

**Stocks:** Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on December 1, 1963, amounted to 248.2 million pounds, approximately 3.0 million pounds lower than at December 1, last year. On November 1, 1963, stock holdings at 264.8 million pounds were 4.3 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

**Supply:** The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on November 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 285.0 million pounds of butter at November 30, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 3.4 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at November 30, 1962.

**Domestic Disappearance:** The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in November amounted to 34.3 million pounds of butter, an increase of 3.9 million pounds or 13.0 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.83 pounds as compared with 1.63 pounds in November, 1962.

**Prices at Montreal:** Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 51 cents per pound in November, as against 50 3/4 cents in November, 1962.

**Cheddar Cheese**

**Production:** Cheddar cheese production in November amounted to approximately 8.9 million pounds, an increase of 0.8 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

**Prices:** The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 38 cents per pound in November. The comparative price in 1962 was 37 1/2 cents.

**Ice Cream Mix**

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in November was approximately 1.4 million gallons or 109 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
