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# THE DAIRY REVIEW 



The preliminary estimate of milk produced in February is $1,049,000,000$ pounds. This is 1.3 per cent greater than production in the same month last year, and would make the total estimate of production during the first two months of the year 2,203,000,000 pounds. This is 1.3 per cent higher than production in January and February, 1962.

About 42 per cent, or $435,000,000$ pounds, of the milk produced in February was used for dairy factory products. This was 1.1 per cent greater than that utilized during February, 1962, with increased quantities going into the manufacture of creamery butter, cheese and concentrated whele milk products more than offsetting a 30 per cent decline in milk utilization for ice cream mix. During January and February, 1.3 per cent more milk was utilized for dairy factory products than in the corresponding period a year ago.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during February, for the purpose of the preliminary estimates are calculated at $503,000,000$ pounds, an increase of 1.6 per cent over fluid sales in February, 1962. This assumes the same relationship to year-arlier estimates as the month of January.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milik cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 0.5 per cent above that used in February, 1962, while milk for livestock feeding was 2.9 per cent above that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, Feport 2.6 par cent fewer cows kept on farms at February 25, and 1.9 per cent less cows being milked that at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked an farms in the sample, increased 3.8 per cent above the level at February 15, 1962.

It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in January, 1963

Farm Milk Froductions The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in January amounted to $1,154,036,000$ pounds, an increase of 16 million pounds or 1.4 per cent above that of January, 1962. Of this amount, 504 million pounds or 44 per cent was utilized in factory production and approximately 503 million pounds or 43 per cent was used for fluid sales.

Fluid Saless Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to $503,296,000$ pounds in January, an increase of approximately 8 million pounds in comparison with January of the previous year. This included about 423 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 36 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 80 million pounds representing 7 per cent.

Farm Butters Butter made on farms in January amounted to 486,000 pounds, decreasing 10 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in January amounted to $\$ 34,919,000$. This represented an increase of approximately l. 2 per cent or $\$ 413,000$ in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of $\$ 3.46$ per hundred pounds of milk was 1 cent lower than January, 1962. Fluid milk at $\$ 4.76$ per hundred was 3 cents lower than in January, 1962. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 67.9 cents to 67.8 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 5 cents lower than in January, 1962. Milk used in manufacture decreased from $\$ 2.84$ per hundred in January, 1962, to $\$ 2.79$ per hundred in January, 1963. Cheese milk increased to $\$ 2.79$ per hundred, an increase of 13 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the ale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in January, 1963

Creamery Butter

Productions Creamery butter production amounted to 15.3 million pounds in January, 1963, an increase of approximately 104 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on February 1, 1963, amounted to 227.7 milion pounds, approximately 37.0 million pounds higher than at February l last year. On January 1, 1963, stock holdings at 239.0 million pounds were 41.9 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter ofl represented by stocks on January l, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 254.2 miliion pounds of butter at January 31, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 42.0 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at January 31, 1962.

Domestic Disappearances The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in January amounted to 26.5 million pounds of butter, an increase of 5.0 million pounds or 23.1 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.41 pounds as compared with 1.16 pounds in January, 1962.

Prices at Montreals Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged $511 / 4$ cents per pound in January, as against $631 / 2$ cents in January, 1962。

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in January amounted to approximately 4.3 million pounds. This was approximately the same as that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Pricess The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 35 cents per pound in January. The comparative price in 1962 was $321 / 2$ cents.

Ice Gream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in Janary was approximately 1.1 million gallons or 26 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
