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

Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, March, 1963

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in March is 1,302,000,000 pounds. This is 0.8 per cent less than production in the same month last year, and would make the total estimate of production during the first three months of the year 3,503,000,000 pounds. This is 0.5 per cent higher than production in the January - March period a year ago.

About 45 per cent of the milk produced in March, or 581,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products, a decline of 2.8 per cent from March, 1962. Less milk was utilized for the manufacture of creamery butter and ice cream mix during March, 1963, more than offsetting increases of 4.6 and 0.4 per cent in milk utilization for factory cheese and concentrated whole milk products, respectively. Despite increases for creamery butter, factory cheese and concentrated products, milk utilized for all dairy factory products in the January - March period fell 0.3 below that for the corresponding period a year ago.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during March, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 539,000,000 pounds, an increase of 1.7 per cent over fluid sales in March, 1962. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as the month of February.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 0.8 per cent below that used in March, 1962, while milk used for livestock feeding was 2.7 per cent above that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report 3.4 per cent fewer cows kept on farms at March 15, and 1.5 per cent less cows being milked that at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 2.5 per cent above the level at March 15, 1962. It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in February, 1963

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in February amounted to 1,047 million pounds, an increase of 11 million pounds or 1.0 per cent over that of February, 1962. Of this amount, 435 million pounds or 42 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 476 million pounds or 45 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-February period, the estimated production was 2,201 million pounds, an increase of 26 million pounds over that oroduced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-February period amounted to 940 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 979 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 476 million pounds in February, an increase of approximately 8 million pounds in comparison with February of the previous year. This included about 401 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 38 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 75 million pounds representing 7 per cent. During the two month period, fluid sales totalled 979 million pounds, an increase of 16 million pounds or 1.6 per cent over those of the corresponding 1962 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in February amounted to 361,000 pounds, decreasing 32 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962. For the January -February period, 847,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 21 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in February amounted to \$31,837,000. This represented an increase of 1.4 per cent or \$431,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.49 per hundred pounds of milk was the same as in February, 1962. Fluid milk at \$4.75 per hundred was 1 cent lower than in February, 1962. Creamery butter-fat increased from 66.9 cents to 67.3 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 5 cents lower than in February, 1962. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.73 per hundred, 8 cents lower than in February, 1962. Cheese milk increased to \$2.80 per hundred, an increase of 16 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in February, 1963

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 13.1 million pounds in February, 1963, an increase of approximately 446 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on March 1, 1963, amounted to 215.4 million pounds, approximately 32.1 million pounds higher than at March 1 last year. On February 1, 1963, stock holdings at 226.9 million pounds were 36.2 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier. Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on February 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 240.0 million pounds of butter at February 28, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 36.6 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at February 28, 1962.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in February amounted to 24.6 million pounds of butter, an increase of 4.5 million pounds or 22.4 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.31 pounds as compared with 1.08 pounds in February, 1962.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 51 1/4 cents per pound in February, as against 63 1/2 cents in February, 1962.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in February amounted to approximately 3.4 million pounds, a decrease of 73 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 35 cents per pound in February. The comparative price in 1962 was 32 1/2 cents.

Ice Gream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in February was approximately 1.2 million gallons or 103 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
