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
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The preliminary estimate of fluid milk produced in April is 1,366,000,000 pounds. This is 2.0 per cent greater than production in the same month last year, and would make the total estimate of production during the first four months of the year 5,058,000,000 pounds. This is 0.7 per cent higher than production in the January - April period a year ago.

About 55 per cent of the milk produced in April, or 858,400,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was an increase of 3.5 per cent over factory utilization in April, 1962. More milk was utilized for the manufacture of butter, cheese and concentrated whole milk products than a year ago, which more than offset a 34.2 per cent decrease in milk used for ice cream mix. Creamery butter, the most important of the products, increased 6.3 per cent and factory cheese 13.3 per cent. During the January — April period, 1.0 per cent more milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1962.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in April, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 484,100,000 pounds, an increase of 0.9 per cent over fluid sales in April, 1962. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the January - March period.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 1.5 per cent above that used in April, 1962, while milk used for live tack feeding was 0.7 per cent below that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report 2.8 per cent fewer cows kept on farms at April 15, and 2.5 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 1.8 per cent above the level at April 15, 1962. These sample indications, not necessarily fully representative of production conditions on all farms producing milk, fall short of the estimate of total milk production is not based on the farm sample but is the sum of the estimates of milk utilization.

It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in March, 1963

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in March amounted to 1,291 million pounds, a decrease of 21 million pounds or 1.6 per cent below that of March, 1962. Of this amount, 581 million pounds or 45 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 529 million pounds or 41 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - March period, the estimated production was 3,492 million pounds, an increase of 5 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - March period amounted to 1,520 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 1,508 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 529 million pounds in March, a decrease of approximately 2 million pounds in comparison with March of the previous year. This included about 446 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 35 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 83 million pounds representing 6 per cent. During the three month period fluid sales totalled 1,508 million pounds, an increase of 14 million pounds or 0.9 per cent over those of the corresponding 1962 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in March amounted to 384,000 pounds, decreasing 33 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962. For the January - March period, 1,231,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 25 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in March amounted to \$37,807,000. This represented a decrease of 0.7 per cent or \$273,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.41 per hundred pounds of milk was 4 cents higher than in March, 1962. Fluid milk at \$4.75 per hundred was 1 cent lower than in March, 1962. Creamery butter-fat increased from 66.8 cents to 67.9 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 5 cents lower than in March, 1962. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.73 per hundred, 6 cents higher than in March, 1962. Cheese milk increased to \$2.75 per hundred, an increase of 9 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in March, 1963

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 17.5 million pounds in March, 1963, an increase of approximately 15 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on April 1, 1963, amounted to 205.3 million pounds, approximately 28.9 million pounds higher than at April 1 last year. On March 1, 1963, stock holdings at 215.4 million pounds were 32.1 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on March 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 232.9 million pounds of butter at March 31, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 32.2 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at March 31, 1962.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in March amounted to 27.6 million pounds of butter, an increase of 3.3 million pounds or 13.4 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.47 pounds as compared with 1.31 pounds in March, 1962.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 51 1/4 cents per pound in March, as against 63 1/2 cents in March, 1962.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in March, amounted to approximately 5.3 million pounds, an increase of 39 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 35 1/4 cents per pound in March. The comparative price in 1962 was 32 1/2 cents.

Ice Gream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in March was approximately 1.6 million gallons or 27 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.

Skim Milk Powder Sales in April, 1963

As additional statistical service to the dairy industry, a new survey on net f.o.b. plant selling prices of skim milk powder was started in April. In this survey manufacturing plants are required to report the quantity of product sold in price ranges with intervals of 0.5 cents.

Table 15 is a summary of these reports for the month of April. At time of publication reports had not been received from 16 of 69 plants listed as producing in Quebec and Ontario, therefore, the table should not be interpreted as covering total sales in these provinces.
