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

## PASTURE CONDITIONS ON FARMS KEEPING MILK COWS



JUNE 15th 1962

#### Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, June, 1963

The preliminary estimate of fluid milk produced in June is 2,205,000,000 pounds. This is 1.9 per cent lower than production in the same month last year, and would make the total estimate of production during the first six months of the year 9,182,000,000 pounds. This is 0.2 per cent below production in the January - June period a year ago.

Slightly over 69 per cent of the milk produced in June, or 1,527,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 2.2 per cent below factory utilization in June, 1962. About 5.6 per cent less milk was utilized for the manufacture of creamery butter in June than a year ago, which more than offset a 16.9 per cent increase in milk used for cheese. The June utilization of milk for concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix was virtually the same as that used in June last year. During the January - June period, 0.8 per cent less milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1962.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in June, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 514,500,000 pounds, an increase of 1.5 per cent over fluid sales in June, 1962. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the month of May.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 1.2 per cent below that used in June, 1962, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 11.6 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report 2.3 per cent fewer cows kept on farms at June 15, and 2.2 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 2.5 per cent above the level at June 15, 1962. It should be noted that these sample indications are not necessarily representative of production conditions on all farms producing milk.

Pasture conditions throughout Canada at June 15, except for southern Alberta and the interior areas of British Columbia, were generally favourable. Regional pasture conditions at June 15, 1962 and 1963, are shown by the maps on the opposite page. It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in May, 1963

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in May amounted to 1,899 million pounds, a decrease of 33 million pounds or 1.7 per cent below that of May, 1962. Of this amount, 1,184 million pounds or 62 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 510 million pounds or 27 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - May period, the estimated production was 6,977 million pounds, an increase of 23 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - May period amounted to 3,563 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 2,522 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 510 million pounds in May, an increase of approximately 7 million pounds in comparison with May of the previous year. This included about 426 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 23 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 84 million pounds representing 4 per cent. During the five month period fluid sales totalled 2,522 million pounds, an increase of 46 million pounds or 1.9 per cent over those of the corresponding 1962 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in May amounted to 454,000 pounds, decreasing 32 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962. For the January - May period, 2,101,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 27 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Guah income from the sale of dairy products in May amounted to \$51,033,000. This represented a decrease of 0.2 per cent or \$103,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.01 per hundred pounds of milk was 3 cents higher than in May, 1962. Fluid milk at \$4.72 per hundred was 1 cent lower than in May, 1962. Creamery butter-fat averaged 66.9 cents per pound, the same as in May, 1962, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 2 cents lower than in May, 1962. Cheese milk increased \$2.63 per hundred, 1 cent higher than in May, 1962. Cheese milk increased to \$2.72 per hundred, an increase of 16 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in May, 1963

#### Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 36.6 million pounds in May, 1963, a decrease of approximately 1.8 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on June 1, 1963, amounted to 210.5 million pounds, approximately 20.0 million pounds higher than at June 1 last year. On May 1, 1963, stock holdings at 203.5 million pounds were 19.0 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier. Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on May 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 240.2 million pounds of butter at May 31, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 17.2 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at May 31, 1962.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in May amounted to 29.7 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 2.7 million pounds or 8.4 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.58 pounds as compared with 1.75 pounds in May, 1962.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 50 1/4 cents per pound in May, as against 50 1/2 cents in May, 1962.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in May amounted to approximately 14.3 million pounds, an increase of 2.7 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 35 1/2 cents per pound in May. The comparative price in 1962 was 32 3/4 cents. Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in May was approximately 2.3 million gallons or 34 thousand gallons less than that produced a year ago.

#### Skim Milk Powder Sales in June, 1963

As additional statistical service to the dairy industry a new survey on net f.o.b. plant selling prices of skim milk powder was started in April. In this survey manufacturing plants are required to report the quantity of product sold in price ranges with intervals of 0.5 cents.

Table 16 is a summary of these reports for the month of June. At time of publication reports had not been received from 8 of 68 plants listed as producing in Quebec and Ontario, therefore, the table should not be interpreted as covering total sales in these provinces.
