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
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

PASTURE CONDITIONS ON FARMS KEEPING MILK COWS



DERIVED FROM REPORTS BY ABOUT 4,500 DAIRY CORRESPONDENTS AUGUST 15th 1962

Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, August, 1963

The preliminary estimate of fluid milk produced in August is 2,001,000,000 pounds. This is 0.5 per cent lower than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production during the first eight months of the year 13,297,000,000 pounds, practically unchanged from last year.

Slightly over 68 per cent of the milk produced in August, or 1,366,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 0.5 per cent below factory utilization in August, 1962. Milk utilized for the manufacture of creamery butter in August declined 4.3 per cent from that of a year ago. This decline more than offset increases of 20.1, 4.0 and 2.7 per cent, respectively, in milk utilization for factory cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix. During the January-August period, 0.5 per cent less milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1962.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in August, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 491,200,000 pounds. This is an increase of 1.7 per cent over fluid sales in August, 1962, and assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the May-July period.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 1.9 per cent above that used in August, 1962, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 17.0 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report 1.1 per cent fewer milk cows kept on farms at August 15, and 1.2 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 3.2 per cent above the level at August 15, 1962. It should be noted that these sample indications are not necessarily representative of production conditions on all farms producing milk.

Pasture conditions throughout Canada at August 15, except for a few isolated areas, were generally favourable. Regional pasture conditions at August 15, 1962 and 1963, are shown by the maps on the opposite page. It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in July, 1963

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in July amounted to 2,124 million pounds, an increase of 20 million pounds or 0.9 per cent over that of July, 1962. Of this amount, 1,469 million pounds or 69 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 500 million pounds or 24 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-July period, the estimated production was 11,296 million pounds, a decrease of 10 million pounds below that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-July period amounted to 6,558 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 3,524 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 500 million pounds in July, an increase of approximately 22 million pounds in comparison with July of the previous year. This included about 416 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 20 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 84 million pounds representing 4 per cent. During the seven month period, fluid sales totalled 3,524 million pounds, an increase of 64 million pounds or 1.8 per cent over those of the corresponding 1962 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in July amounted to 440,000 pounds, decreasing 24 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962. For the January-July period, 2,993,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 28 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in July amounted to \$57,130,000. This represented an increase of 2.5 per cent or \$1,393,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$2.90 per hundred pounds of milk was 3 cents higher than in July, 1962. Fluid milk at \$4.70 per hundred was 1 cent lower than in July, 1962. Greamery butter-fat decreased from 67.0 cents to 66.5 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was the same as in July, 1962. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.58 per hundred, the same as in July, 1962. Cheese milk increased to \$2.77 per hundred, an increase of 16 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in July, 1963

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 46.1 million pounds in July, 1963, a decrease of approximately 1.5 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on August 1, 1963, amounted to 247.8 million pounds, approximately 14.5 million pounds higher than at August 1 last year. On July 1, 1963, stock holdings at 229.6 million pounds were 15.8 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on July 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 275.7 million pounds of butter at July 31, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 14.2 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at July 31, 1962.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in July amounted to 27.9 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 0.3 million pounds or 1.0 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.49 pounds as compared with 1.52 pounds in July, 1962.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 50 1/4 cents per pound in July, as against 50 1/2 cents in July, 1962.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in July amounted to approximately 18.1 million pounds, an increase of 3.4 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 38 cents per pound in July, The comparative price in 1962 was 34 3/4 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in July was approximately 3.3 million gallons or 366 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.

Skim Milk Powder Sales in August, 1963

As additional statistical service to the dairy industry a new survey on net f.o.b. plant selling prices of skim milk powder was started in April. In this survey manufacturing plants are required to report the quantity of product sold in price ranges with intervals of 0.5 cents.

Table 15 is a summary of these reports for the month of August. At time of publication reports had not been received from 3 of 68 plants listed as producing in Quebec and Ontario, therefore, the table should not be interpreted as covering total sales in these provinces.
