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


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PASTURE CONDITIONS ON FARMS KEEPING MILK COWS



SEPTEMBER 15th 1963



The preliminary estimate of milk produced in September is 1,800,000,000 pounds. This is only slightly higher than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production for the first nine months of the year 15,115,000,000 pounds, practically unchanged from last year.

Almost 65 per cent of the milk produced in September, or 1,167,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This represented a slight decrease from factory utilization in September, 1962. Milk utilized for factory cheese in September increased 23.4 per cent over that of a year ago, which almost offset respective declines of 3.8, 2.8 and 4.2 per cent in milk utilization for creamery butter, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix. During the January - September period, 0.4 per cent less milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1962.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in September, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 499,100,000 pounds. This is an increase of 2.9 per cent over fluid sales in September, 1962, and assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the June - August period.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 0.3 per cent above that used in September, 1962, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 14.1 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report 1.0 per cent fewer milk cows kept on farms at September 15, and 1.4 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 1.9 per cent above the level at September 15, 1962. It should be noted that these sample indications are not necessarily representative of production conditions on all farms producing milk.

Pasture conditions throughout Canada at September 15 were generally favourable. Regional pasture conditions at September 15, 1962 and 1963, are shown by the maps on the opposite page.

It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in August, 1963

Farm Milk Productions The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in August amounted to 2,019 million pounds, an increase of 8 million pounds or 0.4 per cent over that of August, 1962. Of this amount, 1,366 million pounds or 68 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 508 million pounds or 25 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - August period, the estimated production was 13,315 million pounds, a decrease of 2 million pounds below that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - August period amounted to 7,925 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 4,032 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 508 million pounds in August, an increase of approximately 25 million pounds in comparison with August of the previous year. This included about 425 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 21 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 83 million pounds representing 4 per cent. During the eight month period fluid sales totalled 4,032 million pounds, an increase of 89 million pounds or 2.3 per cent over those of the corresponding 1962 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in August amounted to 437,000 pounds, decreasing 23 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962. For the January - August period, 3,430,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 27 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in August amounted to \$55,423,000. This represented an increase of 2.4 per cent or \$1,293,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$2.96 per hundred pounds of milk was 4 cents higher than in August, 1962. Fluid milk at \$4.71 per hundred was the same as in August, 1962. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 67.2 cents to 66.8 cents per pound, and farm butter at 56 cents per pound was 1 cent lower than in August, 1962. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.67 per hundred, 7 cents higher than in August, 1962. Cheese milk increased to \$2.78 per hundred, an increase of 12 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in August, 1963

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 43.1 million pounds in August, 1963, a decrease of approximately 2.0 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on September 1, 1963, amounted to 261.7 million pounds, approximately 13.4 million pounds higher than at September 1 last year. On August 1, 1963, stock holdings at 247.8 million pounds were 14.5 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on August 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 290.8 million pounds of butter at August 31, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 12.6 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at August 31, 1962.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in August amounted to 29.2 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 0.9 million pounds or 2.9 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.55 pounds as compared with 1.62 pounds in August, 1962.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 50 1/4 cents per pound in August, as against 50 1/2 cents in August, 1962.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in August amounted to approximately 17.2 million pounds, an increase of 2.5 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 38 1/4 cents per pound in August. The comparative price in 1962 was 36 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in August was approximately 2.8 million gallons or 219 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.

Skim Milk Powder Sales in September, 1963

As additional statistical service to the dairy industry a new survey on net f.o.b. plant selling prices of skim milk powder was started in April. In this survey manufacturing plants are required to report the quantity of product sold in price ranges with intervals of 0.5 cents.

Table 16 is a summary of these reports for the month of September. At time of publication reports had not been received from 5 of 68 plants listed as producing in Quebec and Ontario, therefore, the table should not be interpreted as covering total sales in these provinces.
