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

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# THE DAIRY REVIEW



### PRELIMINARY INDICATIONS OF THE DAIRY SITUATION, OCTOBER, 1964.

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in October is 1,527,000,000 pounds. This is 2.0 per cent lower than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production during the first ten months of the year 16,006,000,000 pounds. This is 0.1 per cent above production in the January-October period a year ago.

Almost 63 per cent of the milk produced in October, or 960,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 2.7 per cent below factory utilization in October, 1963. Creamery butter production during the month used 684,000,000 pounds of milk, 2.1 per cent less than in October, 1963, while milk used for cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix declined 3.2, 4.8 and 7.3 per cent, respectively, from that of a year ago. During the January-October period, only slightly more milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1963.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during October for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 434,300,000 pounds, an increase of 0.8 per cent over fluid sales in October, 1963. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the July-September period.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 4.8 per cent below the quantity used in October, 1963, while milk used for livestock feeding declined 5.0 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report a slight increase in the number of cows kept on farms at October 15 and 0.7 per cent fewer cows being milked than at the same date last year.

FARM MILK PRODUCTION, UTILIZATION AND INCOME IN SEPTEMBER, 1964.

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in September amounted to 1,733 million pounds, an increase of 11 million pounds or 0.6 per cent over that of September, 1963. Of this amount, 1,175 million pounds or 68 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 421 million pounds or 24 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-September period, the estimated production was 14,479 million pounds, an increase of 51 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-September period amounted to 9,194 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 3,809 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 421 million pounds in September, an increase of approximately 16 million pounds in comparison with September of the previous year. This included about 355 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 20 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 66 million pounds representing about 4 per cent. During the nine month period, fluid sales totalled 3,809 million pounds, an increase of 74 million pounds or 2.0 per cent over those of the corresponding 1963 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in September amounted to 447,000 pounds, decreasing 17 per cent from the corresponding month in 1963. For the January-September period, 3,541,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 24 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in September amounted to \$49,968,000. This represented an increase of 4.7 per cent or \$2,242,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.13 per hundred pounds of milk was 11 cents higher than in September, 1963. Fluid milk at \$4.96 per hundred was 13 cents higher than in September, 1963. Creamery butter-fat increased from 69.3 cents to 72.0 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was the same as in September, 1963. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.77 per hundred, 6 cents higher than in September, 1963. Cheese milk increased to \$2,94 per hundred, an increase of 10 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates. The estimates, however, do not make any allowances for costs incurred by farmers in the production of dairy products.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in September, 1964.

#### Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 37.0 million pounds in September, 1964, an increase of approximately 660 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on October 1, 1964, amounted to 160.5 million pounds, approximately 108.5 million pounds lower than at October 1 last year. On September 1, 1964, stock holdings at 170.6 million pounds were 91.5 million pounds less than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on September 1, plus production and imports during the month amounted to 207.6 million pounds of butter at September 30, 1964. This was a decrease of approximately 90.8 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at September 30, 1963.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in September amounted to 31.0 million pounds of butter, an increase of 1.6 million pounds or 5.5 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.62 pounds as compared with 1.55 pounds in September, 1963.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 52 cents per pound in September, as against 50 3/4 cents in September, 1963.

#### Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in September amounted to approximately 15.5 million pounds, a decrease of about 1.1 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged  $38\ 3/8$  cents per pound in September. The comparative price in  $1963\ was\ 38\ 1/4$  cents.

#### Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in September was approximately 2.1 million gallons or 228 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
