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

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DECEMBER 1964

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The preliminary estimate of milk produced in December is 1,173,000,000 pounds. This is 2.1 per cent higher than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production for the year 18,428,000,000 pounds, practically unchanged from last year.

Slightly over 51 per cent of the milk produced in December, or 600,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 4.4 per cent above factory utilization in December, 1964, with increased quantities going into all products. Creamery butter production during the month accounted for 406,000,000 pounds of milk, 2.2 per cent more than in December, 1963, while milk used in the manufacture of cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix increased 11.8, 4.0 and 13.0 per cent, respectively. During the January to December period, slightly more milk was used for dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1963.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during December, for the p rpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 439,300,000 pounds, an increase of 1.6 per cent over fluid sales in December, 1963. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the September-November period.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 6.2 per cent below the quantity used in December, 1963, while milk used for livestock feeding was 3.7 per cent below that of a year ago.

FARM MILK PRODUCTION, UTILIZATION AND INCOME IN NOVEMBER, 1964.

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in November amounted to 1,238 million pounds, an increase of 1.5 million pounds or 0.1 per cent over that of November 1963. Of this amount, 689 million pounds or 56 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 416 million pounds or 33 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-November period, the estimated production was 17,255 million pounds, an increase of 32 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-November period amounted to 10,843 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 4,669 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 416 million pounds in November, a decrease of approximately 8 million pounds in comparison with November of the previous year. This included about 352 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 28 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 64 million pounds representing about 5 per cent. During the eleven month period, fluid sales totalled 4,669 million pounds, an increase of 79 million pounds or 1.7 per cent over those of the corresponding 1963 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in November amounted to 414,000 pounds, secressing 12 per cent from the corresponding month in 1963. For the January-liovember period 4,404,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 22 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in November amounted to \$37,972,000. This represented an increase of 3.2 per cent or \$1,162,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.43 per hundred pounds of milk was 9 cents higher than in November 1963. Fluid milk at \$5.02 per hundred was 13 cents higher than in November 1963. Creamery butter-fat increased from 69.9 cents to 72.8 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was the same as in November 1963. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.97 per hundred, 9 cents higher than in November 1963. Cheese milk increased to \$3.08 per hundred, an increase of 13 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates. The estimates, however, do not make any allowances for costs incurred by farmers in the production of dairy products.

PRODUCTION AND PRICES OF DAIRY PRODUCTS IN NOVEMBER, 1964.

Creamery Butter:

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 20.6 million pounds in November, 1964, an increase of approximately 566 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on December 1, 1964, amounted to 118.3 million pounds, approximately 129.9 million pounds lower than at December 1 last year. On November 1, 1964, stock holdings at 138.1 million pounds were 125.9 million pounds less that at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on November 1, plus production and imports during the month amounted to 158.7 million pounds of butter at November 30, 1964. This was a decrease of approximately 125.3 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at November 30, 1963.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in November amounted to 29.6 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 3.7 million pounds or 11 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.55 pounds as compared with 1.76 pounds in November, 1963.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 52 1/2 cents per pound in November as against 51 cents in November, 1963.

Cheddar Cheese:

Production: Cheddar cheese production in November amounted to approximately 9.8 million pounds, an increase of 443 thousand pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 38 3/4 cents per pound in November, the comparative price in 1963 was 38 cents.

Ice Cream Mix:

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in November was approximately 1.5 million gallons or 85 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
