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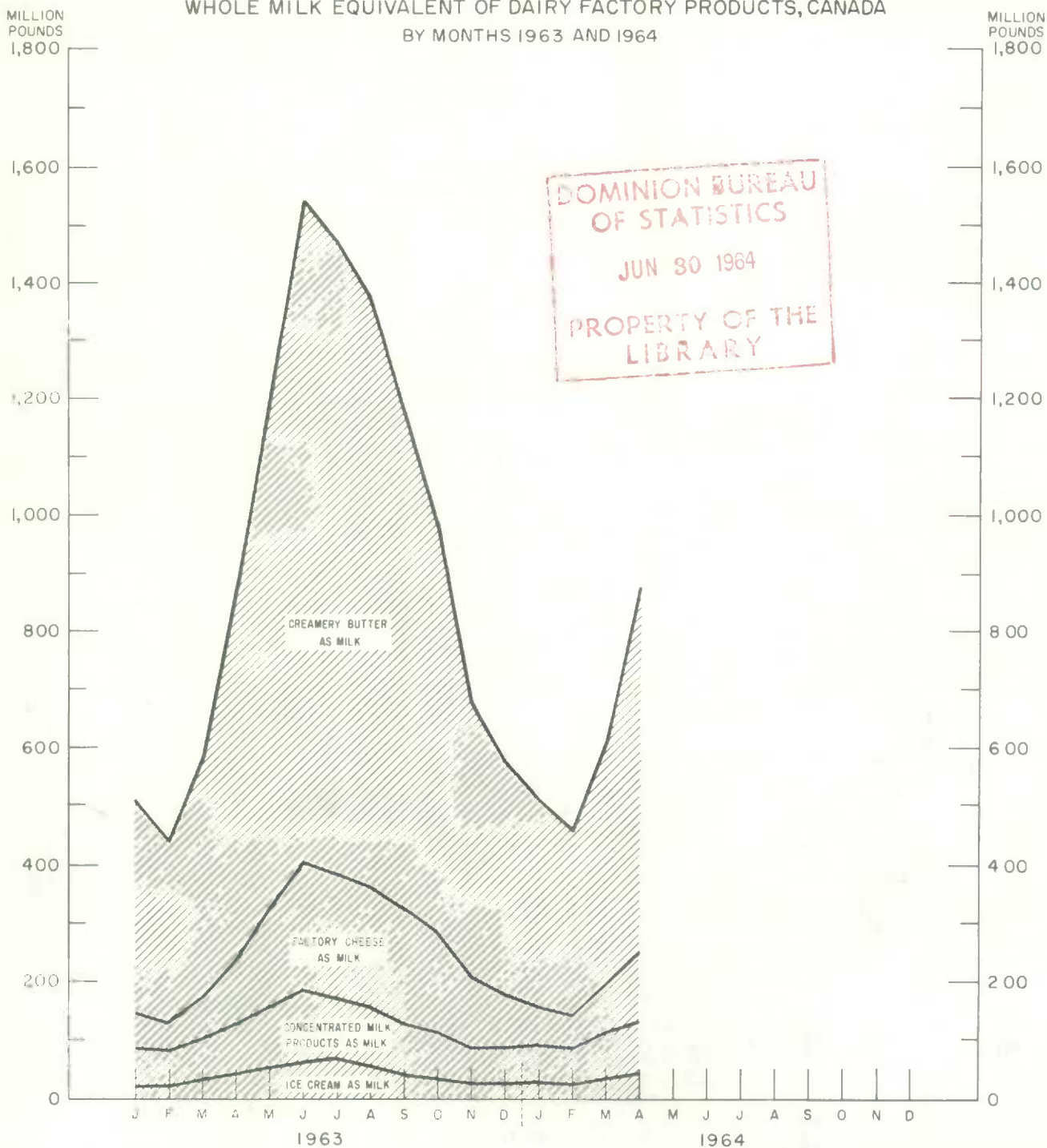
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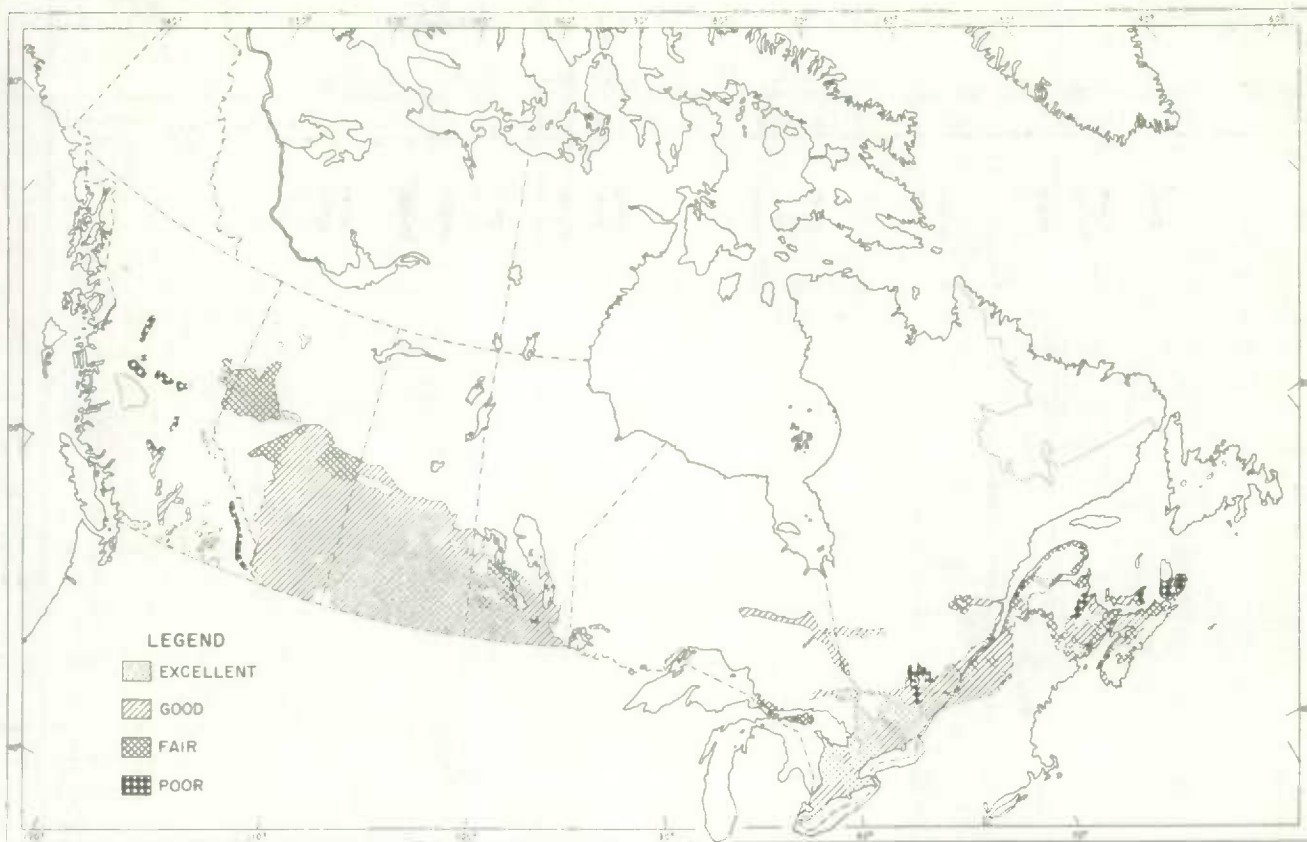

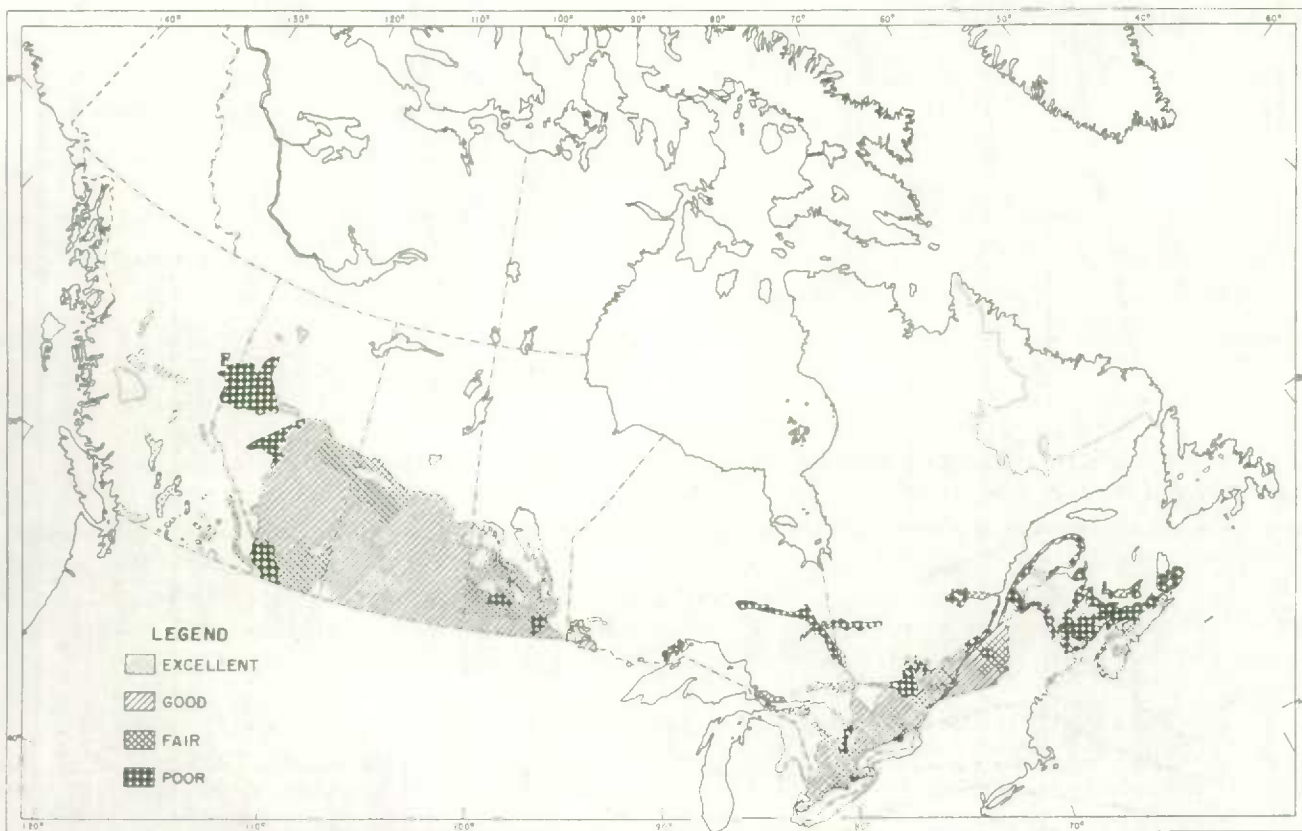
WHOLE MILK EQUIVALENT OF DAIRY FACTORY PRODUCTS, CANADA BY MONTHS 1963 AND 1964

Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, May, 1964

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in May is 1,924,000,000 pounds. This is 1.1 per cent higher than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production during the first five months of the year 7,079,000,000 pounds, also 1.1 per cent above that of production in the January-May period a year ago.

Slightly more than 63 per cent of the milk produced in May, or 1,215,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 2.3 per cent above factory utilization in May, 1963, with increased quantities going into all products. Approximately 1.5 per cent more milk was utilized for the manufacture of creamery butter in May than a year ago, while that for cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix increased 6.3, 3.3 and 0.8 per cent, respectively. During the January-May period, 2.3 per cent more milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1963.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during May, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 520,600,000 pounds, an increase of 2.1 per cent over fluid sales in May, 1963. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the month of April.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 2.1 per cent above that used in May, 1963, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 14.6 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey report 1.8 per cent fewer cows kept on farms at May 15, and a similar percentage decrease in cows being milked compared to the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 3.0 per cent above the level at May 15, 1963.

Pasture conditions throughout Canada at May 15 were generally good and remained favourable to dairying, as shown by the maps on the opposite page. After a slow start, pasture conditions improved greatly and growth was quite rapid during the last half of May. There was very little evidence of winter damage to meadows and pastures.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in April, 1964

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in April amounted to 1,578 million pounds, a decrease of 20 million pounds or 1.2 per cent below that of April, 1963. Of this amount, 878 million pounds or 56 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 515 million pounds or 33 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-April period, the estimated production was 5,155 million pounds, an increase of 54 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-April period amounted to 2,456 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 2,091 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 515 million pounds in April, an increase of approximately 11 million pounds in comparison with April of the previous year. This included about 433 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 28 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 82 million pounds representing about 5 per cent. During the four month period, fluid sales totalled 2,091 million pounds, an increase of 79 million pounds or 3.9 per cent over those of the corresponding 1963 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in April amounted to 300,000 pounds, decreasing 28 per cent from the corresponding month in 1963. For the January-April period, 1,139,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 31 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in April amounted to \$45,570,000. This represented an increase of 4.4 per cent or \$1,914,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.27 per hundred pounds of milk was 10 cents higher than in April, 1963. Fluid milk at \$4.85 per hundred was 10 cents higher than in April, 1963. Creamery butter-fat increased from 68.1 cents to 70.3 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was the same as in April, 1963. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.76 per hundred, 14 cents higher than in April, 1963. Cheese milk increased to \$2.80 per hundred, an increase of 9 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates. The estimates, however, do not make any allowances for costs incurred by farmers in the production of dairy products.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in April, 1964

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 26.9 million pounds in April, 1964, a decrease of approximately 253 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on May 1, 1964, amounted to 168.3 million pounds, approximately 35.4 million pounds lower than at May 1 last year. On April 1, 1964, stock holdings at 176.3 million pounds were 29.1 million pounds less than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on April 1, plus production and imports during the month amounted to 203.1 million pounds of butter at April 30, 1964. This was a decrease of approximately 29.3 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at April 30, 1963.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in April amounted to 28.2 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 0.5 million pounds or 1.6 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.48 pounds as compared with 1.52 pounds in April, 1963.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 51 cents per pound in April, the same as in April, 1963.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in April amounted to approximately 9.8 million pounds, an increase of about 875 thousand pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 35 1/2 cents per pound in April. The comparative price in 1963 was 35 3/4 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in April was approximately 2.0 million gallons or 68 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
