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


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



PASTURE CONDITIONS ON FARMS KEEPING MILK COWS

PRELIMINARY INDICATIONS OF THE DAIRY SITUATION, SEPTEMBER, 1964

This is 0.3 per cent lower than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production during the first nine months of the year 14,463,000,000 pounds. This is 0.2 per cent above production in the January-September period a year ago.

Slightly more than 68 per cent of the milk produced in September, or 1,173,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 0.2 per cent below factory utilization in September, 1963. Creamery butter production during the month used 865,000,000 pounds of milk, 1.8 per cent more than in September, 1963, while milk used in the manufacture of factory cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix declined 5.7, 3.4 and 8.8 per cent, respectively, from that of a year ago. During the January-September period, 0.4 per cent more milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1963.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during September, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 407,900,000 pounds, an increase of 0.6 per cent over fluid sales in September, 1963. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the June-August period.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 0.9 per cent below that used in September, 1963, while milk used for livestock feeding declined 4.3 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey report 0.5 per cent more cows kept on farms at September 15 and 0.1 per cent fewer cows being milked than at the same date last year.

Pasture conditions, as reported September 15, were generally only fair throughout most areas of the West and somewhat below conditions a month earlier and that of a year ago. Pastures in the East, however, were generally good, but below the very good conditions that prevailed in September, 1963.

FARM MILK PRODUCTION, UTILIZATION AND INCOME IN AUGUST, 1964

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in August amounted to 1,889 million pounds, a decrease of 63 million pounds or 3.2 per cent below that of August 1963. Of this amount, 1,323 million pounds or 70 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 418 million pounds or 22 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-August period, the estimated production was 12,746 million pounds, an increase of 40 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-August period amounted to 8,018 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 3,388 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 418 million pounds in August, a decrease of approximately 10 million pounds in comparison with August of the previous year. This included about 350 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 18 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 68 million pounds representing about 4 per cent. During the eight month period, fluid sales totalled 3,388 million pounds, an increase of 59 million pounds or 1.8 per cent over those of the corresponding 1963 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in August amounted to 402,000 pounds, decreasing 26 per cent from the corresponding month in 1963. For the January-August period, 3,094,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 25 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in August amounted to \$53,158,000. This represented an increase of 0.4 per cent or \$229,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.05 per hundred pounds of milk was 11 cents higher than in August, 1963. Fluid milk at \$4.92 per hundred was 18 cents higher than in August, 1963. Creamery butter-fat increased from 69.1 cents to 71.5 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 1 cent higher than in August, 1963. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.71 per hundred, 9 cents higher than in August, 1963. Cheese milk increased to \$2.92 per hundred, an increase of 14 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates. The estimates, however, do not make any allowances for costs incurred by farmers in the production of dairy products.

PRODUCTION AND PRICES OF DAIRY PRODUCTS IN AUGUST, 1964

Creamery Butter:

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 41.6 million pounds in August, 1964, a decrease of approximately 1.6 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on September 1, 1964, amounted to 170.6 million pounds, approximately 91.5 million pounds lower than at September 1 last year. On August 1, 1964, stock holdings at 167.1 million pounds were 81.5 million pounds less than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on August 1, plus production and imports during the month amounted to 208.7 million pounds of butter at August 31, 1964. This was a decrease of approximately 83.1 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at August 31, 1963.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in August amounted to 25.6 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 4.1 million pounds or 13.7 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.34 pounds as comared with 1.57 pounds in August, 1963.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 52 cents per pound in August as against 50 1/4 cents in August, 1963.

Cheddar Cheese:

Production: Cheddar cheese production in August amounted to approximately 17.4 million pounds. This was approximately the same as that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 38 3/8 cents per pound in August, the comparative price in 1963 was 38 1/4 cents.

Ice Cream Mix:

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in August was approximately 2.7 million gallons or 132 thousand gallons less than that produced a year ago.
