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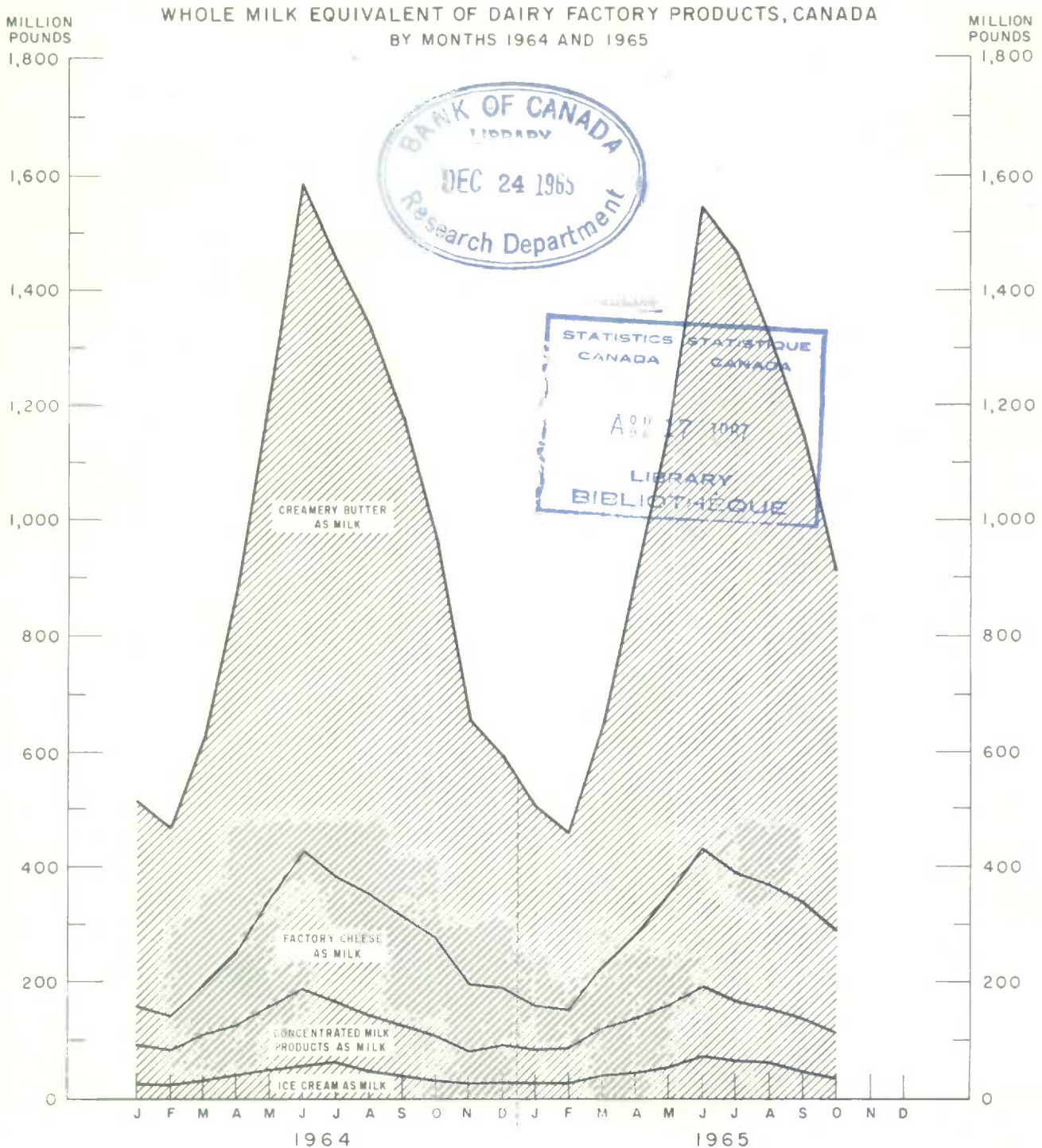
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## THE DAIRY REVIEW

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PRELIMINARY INDICATIONS OF THE DAIRY SITUATION, NOVEMBER, 1965.

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in November is 1,179,000,000 pounds. This is 2.1 per cent lower than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production during the first eleven months of the year 17,077,000,000 pounds. This is 1.2 per cent below production in the January-November period a year ago.

Almost 55 per cent of the milk produced in November, or 644,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 2.0 per cent below factory utilization in November, 1964, despite increased quantities going into all products but butter. Creamery butter production during the month used 430,000,000 pounds of milk, 6.6 per cent less than in November, 1964, more than offsetting increases of 8.9, 7.3 and 10.0 per cent in milk utilization for factory cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix, respectively. During the January-November period 1.7 per cent less milk was utilized for dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1964.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during November, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 414,800,000 pounds, a decline of 0.1 per cent from fluid sales in November, 1964. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the month of October.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 5.6 per cent below that used in November, 1964, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 10.5 per cent from that a year ago. Reports from farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, indicate 0.3 per cent more cows kept on farms at November 15, and 0.8 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample decreased 4.7 per cent below the level at November 15, 1964.

FARM MILK PRODUCTION, UTILIZATION AND CASH RECEIPTS IN OCTOBER, 1965.

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in October amounted to 1,479 million pounds, a decrease of 59 million pounds or 3.8 per cent below that of October, 1964. Of this amount, 915 million pounds or 62 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 443 million pounds or 30 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-October period, the estimated production was 15,898 million pounds, a decrease of 184 million pounds below that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-October period amounted to 10,055 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 4,336 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 443 million pounds in October, a decrease of approximately 1 million pounds in comparison with October of the previous year. This included about 375 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 25 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 68 million pounds representing about 5 per cent. During the ten month period, fluid sales totalled 4,336 million pounds, an increase of 83 million pounds or 1.9 per cent over those of the corresponding 1964 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in October amounted to 304,000 pounds, decreasing 27 per cent from the corresponding month in 1964. For the January-October period, 3,151,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 25 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Receipts: Cash receipts from the sale of dairy products in October amounted to \$47,454,000. This represented an increase of 3.0 per cent or \$1,368,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.49 per hundred pounds of milk was 21 cents higher than in October, 1964. Fluid milk at \$5.07 per hundred was 5 cents higher than in October, 1964. Creamery butter-fat increased from 72.5 cents to 79.1 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was the same as in October, 1964. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$3.06 per hundred, 21 cents higher than in October, 1964. Cheese milk increased to \$3.28 per hundred, an increase of 27 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Estimates of farm cash receipts cover money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Normally both federal and provincial government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates. With regard to current estimates, however, it has not been possible to take into account the supplementary and deficiency payments that will be paid with respect to the 1965-66 dairy year, nor do the estimates include retroactive premium payments by the province of Quebec on milk and cream for manufacturing purposes from October 1, 1964 to April 1, 1965. If possible, these payments will be reflected in year-end revisions for both 1964 and 1965. The estimates do not make any allowances for costs incurred by farmers in the production of dairy products.



PRODUCTION AND PRICES OF DAIRY PRODUCTS IN OCTOBER, 1965.

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 26.7 million pounds in October, 1965, a decrease of approximately 2.6 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on November 1, 1965, amounted to 104.0 million pounds, approximately 34.0 million pounds lower than at November 1 last year. On October 1, 1965, stock holdings at 108.9 million pounds were 52.3 million pounds less than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on October 1, plus production and imports during the month amounted to 135.6 million pounds of butter at October 31, 1965. This was a decrease of approximately 54.8 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at October 31, 1964.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in October amounted to 31.6 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 2.9 million pounds or 8.3 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.63 pounds as compared with 1.79 pounds in October, 1964.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 55-1/8 cents per pound in October, as against 52 cents in October, 1964.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in October amounted to approximately 14.3 million pounds, an increase of about 525 thousand pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 41-3/4 cents per pound in October. The comparative price in 1964 was 38-1/2 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in October was approximately 1.6 million gallons or 59 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
