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

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## THE DAIRY REVIEW



1964

This is 1.4 per cent lower than production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production for the twelve months equal to 18,262,000,000 pounds. This is 1.1 per cent below production in the January-December period a year ago.

Practically 50 per cent of the milk produced in December, or 578,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was 2.9 per cent below factory utilization in December, 1964. Creamery butter production during the month accounted for 377,000,000 pounds of milk, 6.5 per cent less than in December a year ago, while milk used in the manufacture of concentrated whole milk products declined 6.3 per cent. Approximately 11.8 and 4.6 per cent more milk was used for factory cheese and ice cream mix, respectively, than in December, 1964. During the January-December period, 1.8 per cent less milk was utilized for dairy factory products than in the corresponding period a year ago.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during December, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 458,900,000 pounds, an increase of 2.8 per cent over fluid sales in December, 1964. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the September-November period.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 4.6 per cent below that used in December, 1964, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 12.0 per cent from that of a year ago. Reports from farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, indicate 0.3 per cent more cows kept on farms at December 15, and 0.2 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, decreased 2.5 per cent below the level at December 15, 1364.

FARM MILK PRODUCTION, UTILIZATION AND CASH RECEIPTS IN NOVEMBER, 1965.

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in November amounted to 1,205 million pounds, practically the same as that of November, 1964. Of this amount, 644 million pounds or 53 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 441 million pounds or 36 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-November period, the estimated production was 17,103 million pounds, a decrease of 184 million pounds below that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-November period amounted to 10,700 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 4,776 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 441 million pounds in November, an increase of approximately 25 million pounds in comparison with November of the previous year. This included about 375 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 31 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 66 million pounds representing about 5 per cent. During the eleven month period, fluid sales totalled 4,776 million pounds, an increase of 108 million pounds or 2.3 per cent over those of the corresponding 1964 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in November amounted to 291,000 pounds, decreasing 24 per cent from the corresponding month in 1964. For the January-November period, 3,442,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 25 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Receipts: Cash receipts from the sale of dairy products in November amounted to \$39,587,000. This represented an increase of 6.6 per cent or \$2,463,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.65 per hundred pounds of milk was 19 cents higher than in November, 1964. Fluid milk at \$5.09 per hundred was 6 cents higher than in November, 1964. Creamery butterfat increased from 72.7 cents to 77.7 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was the same as in November, 1964. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$3.08 per hundred, 11 cents higher than in November, 1964. Cheese milk increased to \$3.36 per hundred, an increase of 27 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Estimates of farm cash receipts cover money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Normally both federal and provincial government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates. With regard to current estimates, however, it has not been possible to take into account the supplementary and deficiency payments that will be paid with respect to the 1965-66 dairy year, nor do the estimates include retroactive premium payments by the province of Quebec on milk and cream for manufacturing purposes from October 1, 1964 to April 1, 1965. If possible, these payments will be reflected in year-end revisions for both 1964 and 1965. The estimates do not make any allowances for costs incurred by farmers in the production of dairy products.

PRODUCTION AND PRICES OF DAIRY PRODUCTS IN NOVEMBER, 1965.

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 18.4 million pounds in November, 1965, a decrease of approximately 1.3 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on December 1, 1965, amounted to 91.3 million pounds, approximately 27.2 million pounds lower than at December 1 last year. On November 1, 1965, stock holdings at 104.0 million pounds were 34.0 million pounds less than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on November 1, plus production and imports during the month amounted to 122.4 million pounds of butter at November 30, 1965. This was a decrease of approximately 35.3 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at November 30, 1964.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in November amounted to 30.9 million pounds of butter, an increase of 2.9 million pounds or 10.5 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.59 pounds as compared with 1.45 pounds in November, 1964.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 55 1/8 cents per pound in November, as against 52 1/2 cents in November, 1964.

## Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in November amounted to approximately 9.6 million pounds, an increase of about 546 thousand pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 41 3/4 cents per pound in November. The comparative price in 1964 was 38 3/4 cents.

## Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in November was approximately 1.5 million gallons or 136 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
