


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PRELIMINARY INDICATIONS OF THE DAIRY SITUATION, OCTOBER 1972

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in October is 1,441,000,000 pounds, which is 2.4 % below production in the corresponding month last year. This would make the total estimate of production during the first ten months of the year 15,499,000,000 pounds or 1.8 % above production in the January-October period a year ago.

Almost 62 % of the milk produced in October, or 889,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This is 3.7 % below factory utilization in October 1971. Creamery butter production during the month accounted for 537,000,000 pounds of milk, 0.1 % less than in October a year ago; however, milk used for factory cheese and concentrated whole milk products decreased 9.4 and 19.0 %, respectively. Approximately 4.1 % more milk was used for ice cream mix than in October 1971. During the January-October period, 2.5 % more milk was utilized for dairy factory products than in the corresponding period a year ago.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during October, for purposes of the advance preliminary estimate, are calculated at 456,000,000 pounds, an increase of 2.4 % from the sales in October 1971. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the July-September period.

FARM MILK PRODUCTION, UTILIZATION AND CASH RECEIPTS IN SEPTEMBER 1972

Farm Milk Production. — The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in September amounted to 1,624 million pounds, an increase of 36 million pounds or 2.3 per cent over that of September 1971. Of this amount, 1,067 million pounds or 66 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 462 million pounds or 29 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January-September period, the estimated production was 14,058 million pounds, an increase of 303 million pounds from the corresponding period last year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January-September period amounted to 8,941 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 4,021 million pounds.

Fluid Sales. — Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 462 million pounds in September, an increase of approximately 25 million pounds from September of last year. This included about 396 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 25 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 66 million pounds representing about 4 per cent. During the nine month period, fluid sales totalled 4,021 million pounds, an increase of 104 million pounds or 2.7 per cent over those of the corresponding period a year earlier.

Farm Butter. - Butter made on farms in September amounted to 183,000 pounds, decreasing 14 per cent from the corresponding month in 1971. For the January-September period, 1,717,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 10 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Receipts. — Cash receipts from the sale of dairy products in September amounted to \$71,220,000. This represented an increase of 8.2 per cent or \$5,392,000 from the corresponding month last year. The weighted average value of \$4.71 per hundred pounds of milk was 15 cents higher than in September 1971. Fluid milk at \$6.84 per hundred was 11 cents higher than in September 1971. Cream for butter at 69.9 cents per pound butterfat was 0.1 cent higher than in September 1971, and farm butter at 65 cents per pound was 2 cents higher than in September 1971. Milk used in the manufacture of all dairy products averaged \$4.25 per hundred, 15 cents higher than in September 1971. Cheese milk at \$4.25 per hundred, was 10 cents higher than the corresponding month a year earlier. Of all the milk utilized for factory dairy products in September 1972, not more than 84 per cent was eligible for Federal government subsidy.

Estimates of farm cash receipts from the sale of dairy products, as set forth in this report, include the basic plant paying price less haulage and, where applicable, quality premiums, bonuses, patronage dividends and those government subsidies which have been paid indirectly through plants as part of the plant price. They do not include government payments made direct to farmers by government cheque, nor do they reflect any allowance for costs incurred by farmers in the production of dairy products.

PRODUCTION AND PRICES OF DAIRY PRODUCTS IN SEPTEMBER 1972

Creamery butter

Production. — Creamery butter production amounted to 28.7 million pounds in September 1972, an increase of approximately 1.6 million pounds from production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks. - Holdings of creamery butter in store on October 1, 1972, amounted to 57.9 million pounds, approximately 15.2 million pounds less than at October 1 last year. On September 1, 1972, stock holdings at 56.5 million pounds were 17.6 million pounds less than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply. — Stocks of creamery butter on September 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 85.2 million pounds of butter at September 30, 1972. This was a decrease of approximately 16.0 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at September 30, 1971.

Domestic disappearance. — The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in September amounted to 27.3 million pounds of butter, a decrease of 799 thousand pounds or 2.8 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.27 pounds as compared with 1.30 pounds in September 1971.

<u>Prices at Montreal</u>. — Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 68 cents per pound in September, the same as in September 1971.

Cheddar cheese

Production. — Cheddar cheese production in September amounted to approximately 18.9 million pounds, a decrease of about 285 thousand pounds from production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices. - The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 63 1/4 cents per pound in September. The comparative price in 1971 was 72 1/2.

Ice cream mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in September was approximately 2.6 million gallons or 70 thousand gallons less than that produced a year ago.
