## MONTHLY STATISTICS OE THE FLUID IIIK TRADE

Part 1 - April Dstimate of Fluid Milik ance Crem Sules in Canada
Combined Sales: The combined sales of fluid milk and creat in the whole of Canada anounted to $3: 8,472,000$ pounds during the month of April, approximatel: 2-3/4 :nillon pounds or mearly one jer cent more than those of the sane month last year. Of this mount, 84 per cent was sold as milk and 16 per cent was sold as crearn. Dixring the four-month neriod, January to Anril. fluid sales reached a total of $1,357,930$ 000 pounds, an increase of nearly 10 million pounds or nearly one per cent more than that of the correspondirg yerlod in 1348.

Milk Sales: The quantity of fluid milz sold in Canada during Anril amounted to $276,672,000$ jounds, which was about $2-3 / 4$ aillion jounds above the sales of Aprll, 1948. Durin the Janun- Anril pert od of $1919 \mathrm{fluid}-11 \mathrm{k}$ sales anounted to $1,139,-$ 664,000 younds. Compased with the same period of the previous year, these sales represent an increase of aiont $12-1 / 2$ million pounds, or slightly more than one per cent.

Crcan Sales: Cream siles exmressed as milk ayounted to $51,800,000$ nounds in the month of April. The flgures shown reveal a decrease of 32 thousand pounds as compared with the same month of last year. During the first four morths of the year. crean sales on a milk basis were estimated at $218,266,000$ pounds, falling more than 2-1/2 million pounds or about 1-1/4 per cent from January-April, 1948.

Part II - April Sales of Mik and Crean Reported from Forty Markets in Canada (Tables $1=$ IV)

Combined Siles: Ia forty Candian markets selected for tins review, milk and cream sales (the latter expressed as milk) reached a total of $183,700,000$ pounds in Anril, 1949, in comparison with 182,504,000 pounds in April, 1948, representing an increase of slightly more tian one-half of one per cent. Durine the January-April period the percentage increase anounted to less than one per cent.

Kil: Sales: Soles of fluid milk in these forty makets reached a total of $151,330,000$ younds ( $58,655,000$ quarts) during April. Compared with 150,216,000 pounds ( $58,223,000$ quarts) in the sane month of the previous year, an increase of nearly one per cent was indicated. During tive four-month period, January to April, milk sales shown in this report were about one per cent above those reported for the same neriod a year ago.

Crean Sales: The April sales of flitid cream fir forty Canadian markets amounted to $32,370,000$ pounds expressed as milk ( $3,047,000$ quarts of crean), while corresponding figures for the same month of 1948 were $32,288,000$ pounds ( $3,067,000$ quarts of cream). On a milk vasis, April sales increased only fractionally from the same month of last year; diring the four-month period, January to April, there was a reduction of approximately one ner cent as conpared with the same period in 1948. However, on a quart basis, crear. sales showed a droy of about $3 / 4$ of one per cent in April and a reduction of alnost 1-1/2 per cent in the four-inonth period ended Aoril.

## Part III - Estimated Per Capita Per Dav Consumntion of Milk and Cream in Carada

The consumption of milk and crean by the milk Durchasing pooulation of Canada remained unchanged as compared with a year aco. The sales of milk in April, 1949, amounted to 0,67 pints, while cream sales stood at 0.13 pints and total sales (milk and cream on a milk basis) remained as in April, 1948, at 0.80 pints per capita.
