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#### MONTHLY STATISTICS OF THE FIUID MILK TRADE

#### Part 1 - August Estimate of Fluid Milk and Cream Sales in Canada 1/

Combined Sales: The combined sales of fluid milk and cream in Canada smounted to 324,834,000 pounds during the month of August, approximately 13 million pounds or 4 per cent more than those of the same month last year. Of this amount 82 per cent was sold as milk and 18 per cent was sold as cream. During the eight-month period, January to August, fluid sales reached a total of 2,722,795,000 pounds, an increase of nearly 35 million pounds or about 1½ per cent more than that of the corresponding period in 1948. Fluid sales of milk and cream on a milk basis represented 23.3 per cent of the total milk production of Canada.

Milk Sales: The quantity of fluid milk sold in Canada during August amounted to 265,501,000 pounds, which was approximately 12½ million pounds above the sales of August, 1948. During the January-August period of 1949 fluid milk sales amounted to 2,271,096,000 pounds. Compared with the same period of the previous year these sales represent an increase of nearly 40 million pounds, or 1¾ per cent.

Cream Sales: Cream sales expressed as milk amounted to 59,333,000 pounds in the month of August, representing an increase of 400 thousand pounds compared with the same month last year. During the first eight months of the year, cream sales on a milk basis were estimated at 451,699,000 pounds, falling nearly 4 million pounds or one per cent below those of January-August, 1948.

### Part 11-August Sales of Milk and Cream Reported from Forty Markets in Canada (Tables 1-1V)

Combined Sales: In forty Canadian markets selected for this review, fluid sales reached a total of 180,895,000 pounds in August, 1949, in comparison with 174,014,000 pounds in August, 1948. These sales, including cream expressed as milk, represent an increase of 4 per cent over the same month last year. During the January-August period the total of 1,454,908,000 pounds may be compared with 1,435,314,000 pounds in 1948, an increase of almost 12 per cent.

Milk Sales: Sales of fluid milk in these forty markets amounted to 150,012,000 pounds (58,144,000 quarts) during August. These figures when compared with 143,560,000 pounds (55,644,000 quarts) in the same month of the previous year, represent an increase of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. During the eight-month period, January to August, milk sales shown in this report were  $1\frac{3}{4}$  per cent above those of the same period a year ago.

Cream Sales: In terms of milk, the August sales of fluid cream in forty Canadian markets amounted to 30,883,000 pounds (2,919,000 quarts of cream), while corresponding figures for the same month of 1948 were 30,454,000 pounds (2,890,000 quarts of cream). On a milk basis, August sales increased nearly 12 per cent from the same month last year; and during the eight-month period, January-August, there was a reduction of one-half of one per cent as compared with the same period in 1948. However, on a quart basis, cream sales showed an increase of one per cent in August, 1949, and a reduction of one-third of one per cent in the eight-month period ended August.

#### Part 111 - Estimated Per Capita Per Day Consumption of Milk and Cream in Canada

In the month of August the over-all consumption of milk and cream by the milk purchasing population in urban areas increased from a daily average of 0.74 pints in August, 1948, to 0.77 pints in August, 1949. Milk alone rose from 0.60 pints to 0.63 pints. Cream consumption in terms of milk, which was 0.14 pints per capita in August, 1948, stood at the same level in August, 1949.
