Special prices to institutions in cents per gallon are set as follows: Standard Fluid, 75 (67); Special Milk 83, (75).

Special milk retails at 2 cents per quart and 1 cent per pint and per $\frac{1}{2}$ pint above the prices shown for standard fluid. Wholesale discounts for special milk are now set at 1 cent per unit. Previously a discount of $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cents was allowed for wholesale sales in $\frac{1}{2}$ pints.
