

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#### PRODUCTION OF EGGS

March, 1958

The estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/during March was 40.3 million dozen, as compared with 36.7 million dozen last month and the 41.3 million dozen for March last year. The estimate of egg production during the first three months of 1958 was 118.6 million dozen compared with 117.9 million dozen for the same period in 1957.

Average egg production per layer during March was 17.0 eggs compared with 15.1 eggs last month. The rate of lay for March 1957 was 17.1.

Producers sold 33.1 million dozen eggs for market during March compared with the February estimate of 31.0 million dozen. Estimated consumption of eggs by producers during March was 4.5 million dozen.

FROZEN EGGS: Processing to frozen egg during March 1958, in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture was 557,889 pounds.
