## PRODUCTION OF EGGS

November, 1959

The estimated production of eggs in Canada $1 /$ during November was $38,208,000$ dozen as compared with $39,269,000$ dozen for the same month last year. This decrease in production, which amounted to 2.7 per cent, was caused by a slightly lower rate of lay and a 1.2 per cent decline in the number of layers. Production from January to the end of November 1959 exceeded the production for the same period last year by 2.9 per cent.

Egg production increased by 5.5 per cent between October and November 1959. The number of layers rose from $30,998,000$ in actober to $31,572,000$ in November while the rate of lay increased Irow 1,413 to 1,462. The rate of lay in November 1958 was 1,483.

Froducers sold 33.7 million dozen eggs for market during November coupared with 34.6 million dozen in November 1958 and 31.7 million dozen in October 1959. The value of eggs sold for market declined from $\$ 12,767,000$ in November 1958 to $\$ 11,559,000$ in November 1959. The estimate of eggs sold was 2.8 per cent lower than in November 1958, while the decrease in value amounted to 9.5 per cent, which reflects a lower average price to the producer than in 1958.

FROZEN EGGS: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during November 1959 was 804,901 pounds as compared with 244,675 pounds in November 1958.
