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 during December at $41,755,000$ dozen was 1.2 per cent higher than the 41,265,000 dozen produced during the same month last year. A higher rate of lay more than offset a 1.0 per cent decrease in the number of layers. Revised estimates for the last 7 months of 1959, based on the December Semi-annual Crop and Livestock Survey, will be published in the Jamary issue of this publication.

Producers sold 36.8 million dozen eggs for marks $t$ during December compared with 36.4 million dozen in December 1958 and 33.7 million dozen in November 1959. The average value of eggs sold for market declined from 34.3 cents in November 1959 to 27.2 cents per dozen in December. The average value of eggs sold for market in December 1958 was 35.4 cents per dozen.

The prelininary estimate of egg production during 1959 was $462,099,000$ dozen an increase of 2.7 per cent or $12,280,000$ dozen more than in 1958. Although production on the prairies was 4.3 per cent less than in 1958 all other regions had increases. These amounted to 11.5 per cent in the Maritimes, 10.2 per cent in Quebec, 3.3 in Ontario and 5.0 per cent in British Columbia.

FROZEN EGGS: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during December 1959 was 498,126 pounds as compared with 384,439 pounds in December 1958.
