
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## PRODUCTION OF EGGS

May, 1959



Producers sold 35.5 million dozen eggs for market during May compared to 32.5 million dozen in May 1958 and 35.2 million dozen in April 1959. The value of eggs sold for market rose from \$11,416,000 in May 1958 to \$11,577,000. The estimate of eggs sold was 9.2 per cent higher than in May 1958, while the increase in value amounted to only 1.4 per cent, which indicates a lower average price to producers than in 1958.

Of the eggs sold for market, the three Maritime provinces accounted for 7.6 per cent; Quebec, 14.0 per cent; Ontario, 43.1 per cent; the Prairies, 26.4 per cent and British Columbia, 8.9 per cent.

FROZEN EGGS: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during May 1959 was 4,033,651 pounds as compared with 2,319,530 pounds in May 1958
