PRODUCTION OF EGGS

July, 1959

The estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/ during July was 35,448,000 dozen as compared with 33,682,000 dozen for the same month last year. This increase in production, which amounted to 5.2 per cent, was caused by both an increase in the rate of lay and a rise of .7 per cent in the number of layers. Both the rate of lay and the number of layers were lower in July than in June which resulted in a decline in production of 5.5 per cent from last month.

FROZEN EGGS: Processing to frozen egg during July, 1959 in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture was 2,578,420 pounds.

Revised Estimates: Estimates of egg production for the first six months of 1959 were revised in relation to the June 1, 1959 survey of the number of birds on farms and are summarized on pages 4 and 5 of this report. Revised estimates of egg production, by province, for the first six months of 1959, to the nearest thousand dozen (1958 data in brackets) are as follows: Prince Edward Island, 3,314 (3,307); Nova Scotia, 11,446 (9,314); New Brunswick, 4,691 (4,357); Quebec, 33,773 (28,849); Ontario, 102,172 (95,426); Manitoba, 21,965 (21,081); Saskatchewan, 23,186 (24,305); Alberta, 23,624 (26,254); British Columbia, 18,942 (18,281) Canada, 243,113 (231,174).

Turkey Survey - August 1, 1959. Estimated at 8,235,000 the number of turkeys on farms at August 1, this year was 18.3 per cent greater than the corresponding estimate of 6,960,000 in 1958.

Turkey estimates by regions (August 1, 1958 data in brackets) are as follows: Maritime Provinces, 110,000 (170,000); Quebec, 845,000 (950,000); Ontario, 3,050,000 (2,200,000); Manitoba, 1,240,000 (1,050,000); Saskatchewan, 1,340,000 (1,190,000); Alberta, 1,050,000 (950,000) and British Columbia, 600,000 (450,000).

According to estimates, based on the reports received from turkey producers in the August 1 Survey, 2,930,000 birds were marketed before the first of August, 3,075,000 are expected to be marketed from August 1 to Thanksgiving and 4,444,000 between Thanksgiving and Christmas. Thus it is anticipated that there will be an output of 10,450,000 birds in 1959 compared with production of 8,212,000 in 1958. This is an increase of 27 per cent but, with the increasing incidence of broiler turkey production, the increase in tonnage will be less than the increase in the output of birds. Turkey meat production is expected to be about 15 per cent greater than in 1958.




