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PRODUCTIONOF EGGS
NOVEMBER 1960

Production of eggs in Canada 1/ during November, estimated at 40.3 million dozen, was 6.6 per cent more than the 37.8 million dozen produced in November 1959. This increase occurred because a higher rate of lay more than offset a 0.5 per cent decline in the number of layers. In August and September, layers were slightly above the estimates for the corresponding months of 1959 while in October there were 0.5 per cent fewer layers than last year. Producers have tended to carry over a high proportion of older layers for a second season of production than they did in 1959.

Egg production during November was 7.3 per cent higher than in October. The normal seasonal increase occurred because of a higher rate of lay and an increase of 1.7 per cent in the number of layers.

Producer sales of market eggs during November are estimated at 35.7 million dozen compared with 33.3 million in November 1959. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly survey was 40.5 cents per dozen in $0 c t o b e r$ and 40.6 in November. The corresponding farm prices reported in October and November 1959 were 35.2 and 34.1 cents, respectively.

FROZEN EGG: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during November 1960 was 435,875 pounds as compared with 804,901 pounds in November 1959.
