The estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/ during February at $36,332,000$ was 3.7 per cent less than the $37,713,000$ dozen produced in February 1959. Although the rate of lay was higher than in February 1959 the number of layers declined by 7.5 per cent to $27,988,000$. In January the number of layers was 5.1 per cent less than during the same month last year.

Egg production during February was 7.9 per cent lower than in January 1960. The number of layers decreased from $29,389,000$ in January to $27,988,000$ in February while the rate of lay declined from 1,623 to 1,569. The rate of lay in February -958 vas 1,506.

Producers sold 30.5 million dozen eggs for market during February compared with 31.9 million dozen in February 1959 and 34.0 mililon dozen in January 1960. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly sample survey, reached a low of 23.5 cents per dozen in January and increased to 27.1 cents per dozen in February. The corresponding farm price reported in February 1959 was 34.2 cents per dozen.

FROZEN ECGS: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during February 1960 was $1,906,560$ pounds as compared with $1,438,284$ pounds in February 1959.
