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The preliminary estimate of egg production in Canada $1 /$ during June was 36.2 million dozen, 3.5 per cent less than the es timate of 37.5 million dozen for the corresponding month last year. This decline can be attributed to a decrease of 6.9 per cent in the number of layers which more than offset the effects of an increase in the rate of lay. Revised estimates for the first $s i x$ months of 1960, based on the Semi-Annual Crop and Livestock Survey, will be publishod in the July issue of this publication.

Between May and June 1960 a seasonal decline of 2.1 per cent in the number of layers, together with a lower rate of lay, resulted in a decline in production of 7.2 per cent.

Producer sales of market eggs during June are estimated at 30.6 million dozen compared with 31.9 million in June 1959. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly survey, decreased from 30.3 cents in May to 29.3 cents in June. The corresponding farm price reported in June 1959 was 31.3 cents.

The preliminary estimate of egg production for the first six months of 1960 was $228,395^{\prime}$ a decrease of 6.0 per cent from the first half of 1959. Of the eggs produced up to the end of June, the three Maritimes accounted for 7.7 per cent; Quebec, 12.4 per cent; Ontario, 42.2 per cent; the Prairies, 29.3 por cent; and British Columbis, 8.4 per cent.

FROZEN EGG: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during June 1960 was 3,749,062 pounds as compared with $5,295,453$ pounds in June 1959.
