RODUCTION OF EGGS

SEPTEMBER 1960

Production of eggs in Canada 1/ during September, estimated at 35.4 million dozen, was 6.0 per cent more than the 33.4 million dozen produced in September 1959. This increase resulted from a higher rate of lay and 0.7 per cent more layers. In August layers were 1.1 per cent above the estimate for August last year.

Previous to August monthly estimates of layers were lower than for the same months of 1959. Although fewer laying type chicks have been hatched than in 1959 apparently a substantial decrease in the culling of older birds has resulted in layers slightly exceeding the year earlier August and September level.

Egg production during September was 1.6 per cent higher than in August. This increase occurred because the seasonal decrease in the rate of lay from 15.3 to 14.4 eggs per hen was more than offset by a 7.9 per cent increase in the number of layers.

Producer sales of market eggs during September are estimated at 30.6 million dozen compared with 28.7 million in September 1959. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly survey was 38.5 cents per dozen in August and 38.6 in September. The corresponding farm price reported in September 1959 was 35.3 cents.

FROZEN EGG: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during September 1960 was 1, 225,046 pounds as compared with 2,210,791 pounds in September 1959.
