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PRODUCTION OF EGGS

February 1961

The estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/ during February at 36.3 million dozen was 0.7 per cent less than the 36.5 million dozen produced in February 1960. Although the rate of lay was about the same as in February 1960 the number of layers declined by 0.7 per cent to 28.0 million. In January the number of layers was 1.5 per cent less than during the same month last year.

Egg production during February was 10.0 per cent lower than in January 1961. The number of layers decreased from 29.0 million in January to 28.0 million in February while the rate of lay declined from 1,679 to 1,567. The rate of lay in February 1960 was 1,569.

Producer sales of market eggs during February are esstimated at 30.5 million dozen compared with 30.7 million dozen in February 1960. The average price of eggs to producers, as reported in the monthly sample survey, was 30.1 cents per dozen in January and increased to 32.1 cents per dozen in February. The corresponding farm prices reported in January and February 1960 were 23.5 and 27.2 cents, respectively.

FROZEN EGGS: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during February 1961 was 1,344,062 pounds as compared with 1,906,560 pounds in February 1960.
