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PRODUCTION OF EGGS

MARCH 1961

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The estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/during March at 40.6 million dozen was 3.6 per cent more than the 39.2 million dozen produced in March 1960. Although the number of layers declined by 0.4 per cent to 27.4 million the rate of lay increased from 1,725 to 1,790. In February the number of layers was 0.7 per cent less than during the same month last year.

Producer sales of market eggs during March are estimated at 33.8 million dozen compared with 32.5 million dozen in March 1960. The average price of eggs to producers, as reported in the monthly sample survey, was 32.1 cents per dozen in February and 32.3 cents per dozen in March. The corresponding farm prices reported in February and March 1960 were 27.2 and 32.6 cents, respectively.

Egg production in the first quarter of 1961 was 117.2 million dozen an increase of 1.7 per cent from January to March production in 1960. This output was obtained from 0.9 per cent fewer layers than last year.

FROZEN EGGS: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during the four week period ending March 25, 1961 was 789,947 pounds as compared with 1,324,213 pounds during the corresponding period in 1960.
