PRODUCTIONOF EGGS
JUNE 1961

The preliminary estimate of egg production in Canada $1 /$ during June was 36.2 million dozen, 2.6 per cent less than the estimate of 36.8 million dozen for the corresponding month list year. The number of layers declined by 0.6 per cent to 25.6 million while the rate of lay decreased from 1,728 to 1,722 eggs per 100 hens. Revised estimates for the first six monthe of 1961, based on the Semi-Annual Crop and Livestock Survey, will be published in the July issue of this publication.

Betreen May and June 1961 a seasonal decline of 2.7 per cent in the number of layers, together with a lower rate of lay, resulted in a decline in production of 7.3 per cent.

Producer sales of market eggs during June are estimated at 30.5 million dozen compared with 31.2 millios dozen in sune 1960. The average price of eggs to producers, as reported in the monthly sample survey was 31.6 conts per dozen in May and 33.7 cents per dozen in June. The corresponding farm prices reported in May and June 1960 were 30.4 and 29.5 cents, respectively.

The preliminary estimate of egg production for the first six months of 1961 was 231.6 million dozen an increase of 0.3 per cent from the first half of 1960. Of the eggs produced up to the end of June, the three Maritimes accounted for 7.3 per cent; Quebec, 23.5 per cont; Ontario, 42.1 per cent, the Prairies, 28.3 per cent; and British Columbia, 8.8 per cent.

FROZEN EGG: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspect$10 n$ reporting to the Department of Agriculture during June 1961 was $2,575,151$ pounds as compared with $3,216,324$ pounds in Juno 1960.
