The estimated production of eggs in Canada $1 /$ during October at 33.3 million dozen was 1.3 per cent less than the 33.7 million dozen produced in October 1961. The number of layers at 26.8 million was 1.9 per cent lower than in October 1961 while the rate of lay increased slightly to 1,501 eggs per 100 layers from 1,494 last year. In September the number of layers was 0.5 per cent lower than during the same month last year.

Producer sales of market eggs during October are estimated at 29.7 million dozen, 1.7 per cent less than in October 1961. The average price of eggs to producers, as reported in the monthly sample survey was 37.2 cents per dozen in September and 39.5 cents per dozen in October. The corresponding farm prices reported in September and October 1961 were 39.7 and 40.3 cents, respectively.

According to preliminary estimates, egg production in the first ten months of 1962 was 357.3 million dozen, an increase of 1.4 per cent from the 352.2 million dozen produced during the corresponding period in 1961.

FROZEN EGG: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during the five week period ending November 3 was 2,155,440 pounds as compared with $2,108,048$ pounds during the corresponding period in 1961.
