PRODUCTION OF EGGS

DECEMBER 1962

The estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/during December at 37.3 million dozen was 4.3 per cent less than the 39.0 million dozen produced in December 1961. Although the rate of lay was approximately the same as in December 1961 the number of layers at 27.0 million was 4.3 per cent less than a year earlier. In November the number of layers was 3.1 per cent lower than during the same month last year.

ember are estimated at 33.6 million dozen, 4.3 percent less than in December 1961. The average price of eggs to producers, as reported in the monthly sample survey was 41.4 cents per dozen in November and 35.2 cents per dozen in December. The corresponding farm prices reported in November and December 1961 were 40.5 and 33.0 cents, respectively.

According to preliminary estimates, egg production in 1962 was 429.4 million dozen, an increase of 0.5 per cent from the 427.1 million dozen produced during 1961.

FROZEN EGG: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during the four week period ending December 29 was 340,628 pounds as compared with 573,117 pounds during the corresponding period in 1961.
