STATISTICS STATISTIQUE

Estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/ during May at 41.2 million dozen was 6.9 per cent more than the 38.6 million dozen produced in May 1961. The estimated number of layers at 26.7 million was 3.1 per cent higher than a year earlier and the rate of lay increased by 3.8 per cent to 1,867 eggs per 100 layers. In April the number of layers was 1.6 per cent higher than during the same month last year.

Producer sales of market eggs during May are estimated at 34.9 million dozen compared with 32.0 million dozen in May 1961. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly sample surveys was 32.6 cents per dozen in April and 29.3 cents per dozen in May. The corresponding farm prices reported in April and May 1961 were 31.3 and 31.7 cents, respectively.

Egg production in the first five months of 1962 was 196.5 million dozen, an increase of 1.3 per cent from the 194.0 million dozen produced during the corresponding period of 1961.

FROZEN EGGS: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during the four week period ending June 2 was 2,765,295 pounds as compared with 2,464,369 pounds during the corresponding period in 1961.
