PRODUCTION OF EGGS

FEBRUARY 1963



The estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/during February at 33.2 million dozen was 4.1 percent less than the 34.6 million dozen produced in February 1962. The estimated number of layers at 26.1 million was 2.3 per cent less than a year earlier while the rate of lay decreased to 1,533 per 100 layers from 1,562. A decrease of 11.8 percent in the production of eggs between January and February is largely attributable to the difference in length of month.

Sales of market eggs during February are estimated at 29.0 million dozen 4.2 per cent less than in February 1962. The average price of eggs to producers, as reported in the monthly survey was 36.3 cents per dozen in February 1963 compared to 33.2 cents per dozen in February 1962.

FROZEN EGG: Processing to frozen egg during the four week period ending March 2 in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture was 846,451 pounds as compared with 2,072,085 pounds during the corresponding period in 1962.
