Estimated production of eggs in Canada d/ dirine Soptember at 32.5 million dozen was 2.5 per cent less than the 33.3 million dozen produced in September 1962. The estimated number of layers at 26.1 million was 3.9 per ceat lower than a year earlier while the rate of lay increased by 1.6 per cent to 1,503 eggs per 100 layers.

Sales of market eggs during September are estimated at 28.5 million dozen compared with 29.8 million dozen in September 1962. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly survey was 43.9 cents per dozen in September and 39.0 cents per dozen in August. The corresponding farm prices reported in September and August 1962 were 37.2 and 37.5 cents, respectively.

According to preliminary estimates, ege production in the first nine months of 1963 was 312.3 million dozen, down 4.3 per cont from the 326.3 million dozen produced during the corresponding period of 1962 .

FROZR EGGS: Processing to Prozen ege in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during the four week period ending September 28 was 894,821 pounds as compared with $1,151,480$ pounds during the corresponding period in 1962.
