

Estimated production of eggs in Canada(1) during September at 31.5 million dozen was 9.0 per cent less than the 34.7 million dozen produced in September, 1964. The estimated number of layers at 25.5 million was 7.3 per cent lower than a year earlier and the rate of lay decreased 2.0 per cent to 1,493 eggs per 100 layers.

Sales of market eggs during September are estimated at 27.4 million dozen, 9.8 per cent less than in September, 1964. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly sample survey was 38.9 cents per dozen in September and 36.8 cents per dozen in August. The corresponding farm prices reported in September and August 1964 were 32.5 and 34.6 cents, respectively.

According to preliminary estimates egg production in the first nine months of 1965 was 325.9 million dozen, an increase of 0.2 per cent over the 325.3 million dozen produced during the corresponding period of 1964.

Frozen Eggs: Processing to frozen egg in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture during the four week period ending September 25 was 997,543 pounds as compared with 1,048,416 pounds during the corresponding period in 1964.
