## PRODUCTION OF EGGS

December 1966


Estimated production of eggs in Canada(1) during December at 37.8 million dozen was 0.8 per cent more than the 37.5 million dozen produced in December 1965. The estimated number of layers at 27.3 million was virtually the same as a year earlier and the rate of lay increased 0.8 per cent to 1,671 eggs per 100 layers.

Sales of market eggs during December are estimated at 33.4 million dozen, 0.5 per cent more than in December, 1965. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly sample survey was 45.9 cents per dozen in December and 46.6 cents per dozen in November. The corresponding farm prices reported in December and November 1965 were 44.7 and 45.7 cents, respectively.

According to preliminary estimates egg production in 1966 was 415.6 million dozen, a decrease of 4.0 per cent from the 432.8 m 111 on dozen produced during 1965.

EGG PRODUCTS: Frozen and other egg products from registered premises during the 4 week period ending December 31 was 934,228 pounds as compared with 314,200 pounds during the corresponding period in 1965 according to figures published by the Canada Department of Agriculture.
