PRODUCTION OF EGGS

APRIL 1966


Estimated production of eggs in Canada(1) during April at 36.3 million dozen was 5.4 per cent less than the 38.3 million dozen produced in April 1965. The estimated number of layers at 25.1 million was 3.6 per cent less than a year earlier while the rate of lay decreased by 1.9 per cent to 1,746 eggs per 100 layers.

Sales of market eggs during April are estimated at 30.7 million dozen, 5.4 per cent fewer than in April 1965. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly sample survey was 42.3 cents per dozen in April and 40.5 cents per dozen in March. The corresponding farm prices reported in April and March 1965 were 32.2 and 30.9 cents, respectively.

According to preliminary estimates egg production in the first four months of 1966 was 143.3 million dozen, a decrease of 5.5 per cent from the 151.6 million dozen produced during the corresponding period of 1965.

Egg Products: Egg Products from registered premises during the five week period ending April 30 was 1,193,081 pounds as compared with 1,412,789 pounds during the corresponding period in 1965 according to figures published by the Canada Department of Agriculture.
