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PRODUCTION OF EGGS

December 1967

Preliminary estimates show that egg production in Canada rose by 7.5 per cent from December 1966 to December 1967. The number of layers increased by 5.1 per cent from December 1966 to December 1967 and the rate of lay increased by 1.6 per cent. The preliminary estimate of egg production in 1967 at 443.3 million dozen was 7.5 per cent higher than the 412.5 million dozen produced in 1966.

According to the D.B.S. monthly sample survey, poultry producers received an average of 33.4 cents per dozen in December 1967 compared with 45.8 cents in December 1966.

Eggs in cold storage and egg stations as of January 1, 1968 show a rise of 69.9 per cent over the previous year. Frozen eggs rose by 140.8 per cent while shell eggs remained unchanged.

Egg products: Frozen and other egg products from registered premises, during the five week period ending December 30, was 859,075 pounds as compared with 934,228 pounds during the corresponding period in 1966. (Source "Poultry Market Report" Canada Department of Agriculture).
