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
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April 1967

Estimated production of eggs in Canada(1) during April at 37.1 million dozen was 3.1 per cent more than the 36.0 million dozen produced in April 1966. The estimated number of layers at 25.7 million was 3.5 per cent more than a year earlier but the rate of lay decreased by 0.2 per cent to 1,743 eggs per 100 layers.

Sales of market eggs during April are estimated at 31.5 million dozen, 3.5 per cent more than in April 1966. The average price of eggs to producers as reported in the monthly sample survey was 34.7 cents per dozen in April and 35.6 cents per dozen in March. The corresponding farm prices reported in April and March 1966 were 42.5 and 40.6 cents, respectively.

According to preliminary estimates egg production in the first four months of 1967 was 146.7 million dozen, an increase of 3.2 per cent from the 142.2 million dozen produced during the corresponding period of 1966.

Eggs in cold storages and egg stations (shown in table 5 of this report) at May 1, 1967 amounted to the equivalent of 6.2 million dozen 56.8 per cent more than at May 1, 1966. Frozen eggs increased by 88.4 per cent while shell eggs increased by 20.6 per cent.

Stocks of poultry meat (shown in table 6 of this report) at May 1, 1967 were 56.6 per cent higher than a year earlier. More detailed information on stocks of poultry and eggs can be obtained from the D.B.S. publication "Stocks of Dairy and Poultry Products" catalogue number 32009.

Egg products: Frozen and other egg products from registered premises, during the four week period ending April 29, was 2,586,771 pounds as compared with 1,085,525 pounds during the corresponding period in 1966. (Source "Poultry Market Report" Canada Department of Agriculture).
