POULTRY ESTIMATES

APRIL - 1951

The estimated production of eggs in Canada during April was 34.9 million dozen as compared with the March estimate of 33.0 million dozen and 36.1 million dozen during April, 1950. The 1.9 million dozen increase from last month resulted mainly from the substantial increase in egg production per hen in the Prairie Provinces. The estimate of egg production during the first four months of 1951 was 122.8 million dozen compared to 130.1 million dozen during the same four months of 1950.

Average monthly egg production per hen was 16.4 eggs for April as compared with 14.9 eggs last month and 16.7 for April, 1950. All provinces show an increase in average egg production from last month, varying from a slight increase in Nova Scotia to increases of from 2 to 3 eggs per hen in each of the Prairie Provinces.

Producers sold 26.8 million dozen eggs for market during April compared with 25.7 million dozen during the previous month. The estimated consumption of eggs by producers during April was 6.1 million dozen.

FROZEN EGGS: Production of frozen eggs during April, 1951, in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture and in uninspected plants reporting to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics was 1,127,224 pounds.
