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## POULTRY ESTIMATES

JULY 1951

The estimated production of eggs in Canada <sup>1/</sup>during July was 25.3 million dozen as compared with the revised <sup>2/</sup>June estimate of 27.3 million dozen and 24.9 million dozen during July, 1950. The revised <sup>2/</sup>estimate of egg production during the first seven months of 1951 was 204.2 million dozen compared to 219.4 million dozen during the same seven months of 1950.

Average egg production per hen during July was 15.3 eggs as compared with 15.5 eggs last month and 13.6 for July 1950.

Producers sold 19.9 million dozen eggs for market during July compared with a revised <sup>2/</sup>estimate of 21.3 million dozen during the previous month. The estimated consumption of eggs by producers during July was 4.8 million dozen.

FROZEN EGGS: Production of frozen eggs during July, 1951, in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture and in uninspected plants reporting to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was 1,979,892 pounds.
