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## POULTRY ESTIMATES

OCTOBER 1952

The estimated production of eggs in Canada  $\frac{1}{}$  during October was 29.7 million dozen as compared with the September estimate of 26.1 million dozen. The estimate of egg production during the first ten months of 1952 was 303.4 million dozen. dozen.

Average egg production per hen over six months of age during October was 13.6 eggs as compared with 14.2 eggs last month.

Producers sold 25.5 million dozen eggs for market during October compared with 21.2 million dozen eggs during the previous month. The estimated consumption of eggs by producers during October was 4.1 million dozen.

FROZEN EGGS: Production of frozen eggs during October, 1952 in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture and in uninspected plants reporting to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics was 174,000 pounds.
