PRODUCTION OF EGGS

FEBRUARY 1954

The estimated production of eggs in Canada 1/ during February was 34.7 million dozen as compared with the revised 2/ January estimate of 36.6 million dozen and 29.9 million dozen during February, 1953.

Average egg production per layer during February was 13.9 eggs as compared with 14.2 eggs last month. The egg production figure for February 1953 was 14.3 but the three figures are not directly comparable since egg production during 1953 was based on eggs per hen over 6 months old. However the proportion of laying pullets under 6 months old was quite small in February.

Producers sold 26.7 million dozen eggs for market during
February compared with 30.6 million dozen eggs during January and 22.9 in
February 1953. The estimated consumption of eggs by producers during
February was 4.2 million dozen.

FROZEN ECGS: Production of frozen egg during February, 1954 in all plants under inspection reporting to the Department of Agriculture and in uninspected plants reporting to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics was 991,169 pounds.
