POULTRY AND EGG PRODUCTION IN CANADA - 1947

Data on poultry and egg production and utilization are now obtained from producers by monthly sample surveys. This has resulted in a change in method of estimating which applies to 1946 and 1947 data. Hence the estimates presented in this report are not strictly comparable with the series covering previous years.

During 1947, 56,252,000 farm poultry weighing 301,389,000 pounds were sold or used for poultry meat at a value of \$81,667,000. These data are all larger than the revised figures for 1946 when \$73,751,000 was the value of 51,815,000 birds that weighed 265,171,000 pounds.

In addition to the farm birds it was estimated that producers elsewhere than on farms sold or used for meat during 1947 a total weight of 23,105,000 pounds worth a total value of \$6,308,000. Revised figures for 1946 were 20,095,000 pounds valued at \$5,644,000.

The net production of farm eggs in 1947 totalled 373,696,000 dozens as compared with the revised figures of 323,563,000 dozens produced on farms during 1946. The value of the eggs sold and used for consumption and for hatching on farms in 1947 amounted to \$135,298,000, while in 1946 the revised value was \$113,988,000.

Eggs produced in 1947 elsewhere than on farms were estimated to be 33,680,000 dozens net at a value of \$12,586,000. For 1946 the comparable figures were 28,778,000 dozens valued at \$10,310,000.

FARM POULTRY MEAT

The production of fowl and chicken in 1947 amounted to 52,616,000 birds with a total dressed weight of 257,095,000 pounds the value of which was \$64,993,000, as compared with the 1946 revised data of 49,050,000 birds totalling 232,250,000 pounds and valued at \$61,934,000.

Turkey meat came from 2,787,000 birds in 1947 weighing 37,551,000 pounds valued at \$14,565,000. The 1946 revised figures were 1,967,000 turkeys which weighed 26,653,000 pounds with a value of \$10,140,000.

Geese to the number of 424,000 were killed for sale and for use to the value of \$1,521,000 from a total weight of 4,627,000 pounds in 1947, while during 1946 the value was \$1,169,000 from 4,195,000 pounds from 409,000 birds.

There was an increase in duck meat during 1947 as compared with revised data for 1946. There were 425,000 birds killed, weighing 2,116,000 pounds worth \$588,000. In 1946 389,000 ducks were killed for meat. These weighed 2,073,000 pounds and were worth \$508,000.

FARM EGGS

Net egg production in Canada was 15.5 per cent greater than in 1946 as revised. Sales for consumption totalled 296,245,000 dozens at a value of \$106,564,000 as compared with 251,642,000 dozens valued at \$88,260,000 in 1946. Sales of hatching eggs were 11,884,000 dozens worth \$6,184,000 while in 1946 sales were 8,431,000 dozens worth \$4,065,000. There was, therefore, a total cash income from farm eggs of \$112,748,000 in 1947 and \$92,325,000 in 1946.

Farmers used for food 63,790,000 dozens some of which were stored or preserved. These were valued at \$21,807,000. In 1946 comparable figures were 59,844,000 dozens at a value of \$20,828,000. Eggs used for hatching on farms totalled 1,750,000 dozens valued at \$743,000, a reduction from the 1946 data which amounted to 2,067,000 dozens worth \$835,000.

PRODUCTION ELSEWHERE THAN ON FARMS

Many people produce poultry and eggs, not only for their own use, but also for sale, on properties that are not considered as farms for Census purposes. They live on the outskirts of cities and towns and in villages and hamlets. Data from these producers are obtained at the Censuses and from such Census data percentage equivalents of farm data have been calculated and applied for each province as non-farm estimates. These data for 1947 and as revised for 1946 are tabulated herein.
