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STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FISH, OCTOBER 1, 1939.

## ALL FISH.

Stocks of all fish on October 1, 1939 aggragated 37.9 million $1 b$. (including an estimate of $1,200,000 \mathrm{lb}$. for firms who failed to report on time), of which 31.6 million lb, were Frozen Fresh; 1.9 million 1b, Frozen Smoked; and 4.3 million lb . Cured. These figures are greater by 977 thousand 1 b . Fresh and Frozen and less by 2.0 million lb. Smoked, Dried, Pickled and Salted than those of October 1, 1938. As compared with Soptember 1, 1939 figures they are 8.8 per cent less for Frozen Fresh, 1.5 per cent less for Frozen Smoked and 25.3 pur cent greater for Cured.

Tha net "Out-of-Storage" movemont for all classifications was 2.2 million 1b. which is equivalent to 5 por cent of September 1, 1939 holdings as revised.

COD. The stocks of all cod totalled $5,052,425 \mathrm{lb}$. of which $2,016,049 \mathrm{lb}$. were Frozen Fresh: 635,975 lb. Frozen Smoked, and 2,400,401 1b. Cured. These figures are 8.6 per cent greater than last month's stocks and are 279 thousand 1 b . less than the stocks on October 1, 1938.

There was an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 398 thousand $1 b$. as compared with a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 502 thousand 1 b . last year.

The quantity frozen during September 1939 was $767,966 \mathrm{lb}$, as compared with a total of $461,1141 b$. for September 1938.

HADDOCK. All Haddock stocks including Finnan Haddies, were 1,536,681 1 b .
consisting of $954,935 \mathrm{lb}$. Frozen Fresh and 581,746 1 b . Frozen Smoked. These are less by 39.7 per cent than the stocks of September 1,1939 and 2.0 million $1 b$. less than at the same time last year.

The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.0 million lb. Last year the "Out-of-Storage" movenent was 318 thousand 1 b .

The eatch frozen during Soptember 1839, 414,924 1b, was 156 thousand 1 b . greater than the quantity $\overline{\text { frozen }}$ during September 1938.

HAKE, CUSK Stocks of these kinds totalled 197,682 lb . These stocks are 117 \& POLIOCK

SALMON. thousand 1b. less than the revised figures for September 1, 1939.

Holdings of all salmon were $5,549,352 \mathrm{lb}$. made up of $4,322,143 \mathrm{lb}$. Frozen Fresh, 13,543 1b. Frozen Smoked, and 1,213,666 1b. Cured. These holdings are 834 thousand lb . less than at 0 ctober 1,1938 and 25.8 por cont greater than those of September 1, 1939, but some firms usually holding did not report on time.

The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement during September was 1.1 million 1b, as compared with a similar movement of 1.1 million 1 b . during September 1938.

Salmon frozen during Soptember 1939 totalled $1,688,326 \mathrm{lb}$. as compared with 1,536,452 lb . last year.

SEA HERRING. The total stocks of this classification, including Kippers and Bloaters, were $7,329,993 \mathrm{lb}$. as compared with $6,459,725 \mathrm{lb}$. last year, and are 17.2 per cent greater than last month's revised figures.

Quantities of Sea Herring, Fresh and Smoked, including Kippers, frozen during September 1939 were reported as $1,965,413 \mathrm{lb}$. as compared with freezings of $211,240 \mathrm{lb}$. during September 1938.

OTHER.
Other fish stocks amounted to $16,303,436 \mathrm{lb}$. Frozen Fresh, 28, 444 lb . Frozen Smoked and 61,225 1b. Cured, but some firms failed to report on time.

Quantities of Fresh and Smoked frozen during September were 1,704,833 lb.
