FISHERIES OF CANADA - MARCH 1956

CANADA

In March landings in the sea-fisheries of Canada amounted to 107,918,000 lb. -- 136 p.c. higher than the 45,680,000 lb. taken in March, 1955 -- and were valued at \$2,948,000 -- 55 p.c. higher than the \$1,908,000 recorded in the same month of last year.

During the first quarter of this year the value of the catch jumped 55% to \$10,932,000 from the comparable 1955 value of \$7,056,000.

PACIFIC

Landings of fish on our Pacific Coast reached record proportions in March, and were valued at \$1,152,000. This was due almost wholly to an extremely heavy volume of herring being caught in the first eight days of the month before the season closed.

The increased value of the landings of lingcod, clams, shrimps and oysters helped to make up the record total.

ATLANTIC

On our East Coast the total catch -- 40,210,000 lb. worth \$1,796,000 -- was 1% lower in volume but 8% more valuable than the 40,557,000 lb. worth \$1,664,000 reported in March, 1955.

In the first three months of this year landings have risen to 132,510,000 lb. from the 106,710,000 lb. taken in the same period of 1955, and the total value has jumped to \$5,869,000 from \$5,005,000.

The biggest increase appears to be in the haddock fishery in Newfoundland where the reported value of \$869,000 is 90 p.c. higher than the comparable figure for 1955.

STOCKS

On March 31st stocks of frozen fish in Canada amounted to 30,368,000 lb., of which 27,856,000 lb. were frozen fresh and 2,412,000 lb. frozen smoked. Total holdings were lower by 3,969,000 lb. (12%) fresh and by 747,000 lb. (45%) smoked than those of February 29th, 1956. Compared to the end of March, 1955 stocks current holdings of frozen fresh fish were higher by 6,372,000 lb. (30%) and those of frozen smoked fish higher by 367,000 lb. (18%).

EXPORTS

In the first two months of this year fish and fish products worth \$19,553,000 were exported -- approximately 3 p.c. more than the \$19,043,000 sold abroad in the same period of last year.

LA PECHE AU CANADA - MARS 1956

CANADA

En mars, les débarquements des pêches maritimes canadiennes se sont élevés à 107,918,000 livres, soit 136 p. 100 de plus que les 45,680,000 de mars 1955, et ont été évalués à \$2,948,000, c'est-à-dire 55 p. 100 de plus que les \$1,908,000 de l'année dernière.

Au cours du premier trimestre, la valeur de la prise a bondi de 55 p. 100 passant de \$7,056,000 en 1955 à \$10,932,000.

PACIFIQUE

Les débarquements sur la côte du Pacifique ont atteint des proportions record en mars (valeur de \$1,152,000) à cause surtout de la prise extrêmement considérable de hareng pendant les huit premiers jours du mois avant la clôture de la saison.

La valeur accrue des débarquements de lingue, de peignes, de crevettes et d'huîtres a aussi contribué au chiffre record.

ATLANTIQUE

Sur le littoral est, la prise totale, qui se chiffrait par 40,210,000 livres (\$1,796,000), a été inférieure de 1 p. 100 en volume mais supérieure de 8 p. 100 en valeur aux 40,557,000 livres (\$1,664,000) de mars 1955.

Au cours des trois premiers mois de l'année, les débarquements sont passés de 106,710,000 livres un an plus tôt à 132,510,000 livres, et leur valeur totale a bondi à \$5,869,000 (\$5,005,000).

La plus forte augmentation semble avoir été celle de la pêche de l'aiglefin à Terre-Neuve dont le chiffre déclaré (\$869,000) est supérieur de 90 p. 100 à celui de 1955.

STOCKS

Au 31 mars, les stocks de poisson congelé au Canada s'élevaient à 30,268,000 livres, dont 27,856,000 de poisson frais et 2,412,000 de poisson fumé. Le total des approvisionnements était inférieur de 3,969,000 livres (12 p. 100) pour le poisson frais et de 747,000 livres (45 p. 100) pour le poisson fumé, à ceux du 29 février 1956. Au regard de la fin de mars 1955, les stocks actuels de poisson congelé étaient supérieurs de 6,373,000 livres (30 p. 100) et ceux de poisson fumé congelé, de 367,000 livres (18 p. 100).

EXPORTATIONS

Au cours des deux premiers mois de l'année, le Canada a exporté du poisson et des produits du poisson pour une valeur de \$19,553,000, soit environ 3 p. 100 de plus que les \$19,043,000 de la période correspondante de l'année dernière.

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
