A LOW YIELD OF THE COD AND HERRING FISHERIES

The yield of the British Columbia fisheries was satisfactory in April but, on the East Coast, the catch and its value were 20 per cent below those of the same month of 1956. For the first four months, the sea fish landings and landed values were respectively 35 and 30 per cent less than in the preceding year. The mediocre results of the herring, cod and haddock fisheries so far in the year were the major factors contributing to the change. Lobster prices were also significantly less in the current year than in 1956.

ATLANTIC COAST

The landings of fish on the Atlantic Coast were 50.4 million lb. valued at \$2.6 million in April, compared with 63.3 million lb. and \$3.3 million in 1956. The run of herring was delayed this year at the Magdalen Islands and the cod fisheries failed to achieve last year's level in Nova Scotia and Newfoundland. The catch and its value for the first four months were respectively 33 and 24 per cent less than in the previous year. This was largely due to a low catch of groundfish and to a downward trend in lobster prices thus far in the year. A change in the method of collection of fisheries statistics in the Maritimes in 1957 may somewhat contribute to the recorded changes.

BRITISH COLUMBIA

The catch of fish in British Columbia declined somewhat compared with April 1956 but its value was greater than in the previous year. However, the cumulative figures for the first four months, at 195.4 million lb. and \$3.8 million, were respectively 42 and 32 per cent less than in 1956. This was the result of the lower yield of the winter herring fishery in the first months of 1957 than in the previous year.

INVENTORIES OF FISH AND EXPORTS

The total reported stocks of frozen fish were 44.8 million lb. at the end of April, 23.5 per cent higher than last year. The increase was mainly accounted for by heavier inventories, this year than in 1956, of salmon and halibut originating from the West Coast. Bait and animal foods supplies were also greater this year than last, but these stocks were significantly less than a month ago. The inventories of fresh-frozen groundfish fillets, at 10.2 million lb., were slightly less than last year at the same date.

The stocks of salted groundfish were reported higher this year than last, at the end of April. However, it is noteworthy that the coverage of firms reporting salted fish stocks has been increasing since mid-1955.

The exports of fish and fishery products in the first four months declined by 10 per cent in value from \$38.4 million in 1956 to \$34.4 million in the current year. The items contributing mainly to the decrease were dried-salted cod, canned salmon and herring industrial oil.

UN MOINDRE RENDEMENT DE LA PECHE AU HARENG ET A LA MORUE

Le rendement de la pêche a été satisfaisant sur la côte du Pacifique en avril, mais les prises et leur valeur sur la côte de l'Est ont enrégistré un déclin de 20 pour cent. Pour les quatre premiers mois de l'année, les captures de poisson en eau salée ont diminué de 35 pour cent et leur valeur de 30 pour cent, comparativement à l'année dernière. Cette diminution est dûe principalement à un rendement diminué de la pêche au hareng et aux poissons de fonds. Le prix du homard fut aussi inférieur à celui de l'année précédente.

COTE DE L'ATLANTIQUE

Les prises de poisson sur la Côte de l'Est, en avril, s'établissent à 50.4 million de livres avec une valeur au pêcheur de \$2.6 millions, comparativement à 63.3 millions de livres et \$3.3 millions en 1956. L'arrivée du hareng a été retardée aux Iles-de-la-Madeleine et la pêche à la morue a donné médiocrement en Nouvelle-Ecosse et à Terre-Neuve. Les captures des quatre premiers mois furent de 33 pour cent inférieures à celles de 1956 et leur valeur a diminuée de 24 pour cent. Ces résultats dépendent en grande partie du rendement diminué de la pêche au hareng et aux poissons de fonds jusqu'à date, ainsi que de la baisse du prix du homard.

COLOMBIE-BRITANNIQUE

Le rendement de la pêche en Colombie-Britannique a été quelque peu diminué en avril, comparativement à l'année dernière, mais la valeur s'est légèrement accrue. Toutefois la capture, pour les quatre premiers mois, est inférieure à celle de l'année précédente par 42 pour cent en quantité et 32 pour cent en valeur. Cette diminution tient au rendement fort diminué de la pêche au hareng, comparativement à 1956.

STOCK ET EXPORTATIONS DE POISSON

Le total déclaré des stocks de poisson congelé était de 44.8 millions de livres à la fin d'avril, soit une augmentation de 23.5 pour cent comparativement à l'année précédente. Le saumon et le flétan de la Côte-du-Pacifique furent les espèces contribuant le plus à l'augmentation. Les stocks de poissons pour boette ou pour alimentation animale étaient aussi élevés, mais enregistraient une diminution importante par rapport au mois précédent. Les stocks de filets de poissons de fonds étaient rapportés à 10.2 millions de livres, soit un peu inférieurs à ceux de 1956 à la même date.

Les stocks de poissons de fonds salés étaient rapportés plus élevés que ceux de l'année précédente. Il faut toutefois noter que le nombre des firmes faisant rapport a sensiblement augmenté depuis le milieu de 1955.
