HEAVY COD LANDINGS IN NEWFOUNDLAND FOR AUGUST

The total landings of sea fish and shellfish in August were 317.2 million pounds, valued at \$15.7 million. This was 15 per cent more than for the same month of last year in quantity and an increase of 8 per cent in the value. The cod fisheries yielded at high level in Newfoundland and salmon fishing on the West Coast was more successful in August last than in the same month of 1956.

For the period January-August the total catch declined by 13 per cent to 1,325.1 million pounds from 1,519.7 million in 1956; the landed value fell by 12 per cent to \$60.3 million from \$68.4 million in the preceding year. Practically all the major fisheries contributed to the decrease, on both coasts.

BRITISH COLUMBIA - The value of all landings during August in British Columbia increased by 11 per cent to \$8.2 million from \$7.3 million in 1956, due mainly to a change in the salmon fishery. This fishery yielded 56.2 million pounds valued at \$7.4 million, against 41.7 million pounds and \$6.2 million in 1956, thus showing increases of 34 per cent in quantity and of 20 per cent in value. The landings of pink and sockeye were substantially heavier than a year ago, while those of coho declined somewhat.

The catch of halibut was nearly equal to that of 1956, but its value fell significantly. The landings of all species, at 63.5 million pounds, were 10 per cent less than in the preceding year for the same month, as a result of a low yield of the herring fishery. Very few seiners operated on herring during August and as a result landings were light and totalled 1.3 million pounds versus 22.4 million in 1956.

The January-August landings decreased by 26 per cent to 365.9 million pounds from 493.8 million in 1956. However it is to be noted that the 1956 yearly catch was an all time record. The value of the catch since the beginning of the year fell by 16 per cent to \$23.0 million from \$27.3 million in 1956, reflecting a loss of income from all the major fisheries - halibut, herring and salmon.

ATLANTIC COAST - The catch of fish and shellfish in August for the Atlantic Coast climbed by 23 per cent to 253.7 million pounds from 206.4 million in 1956, while the landed value increased by 4 per cent to \$7.5 million from \$7.2 million. Cod and herring were the main species contributing to the change. The cod catch reached 156.0 million pounds valued at \$3.5 million, against 120.7 million pounds and \$2.7 million a year ago. This increase was largely accounted for in the province of Newfoundland due to the unexpected extension of the cod trap fishery which in many areas was still accounting for large catches at the end of the month. Usually cod trap fishing ends at about mid-August.

Fishing for herring was particularly successful in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. On the other hand, the lobster fishery obtained only mediocre results in district 8 which was opened to fishing on August 10. The lobster landings fell by 30 per cent to 3.8 million pounds from 5.3 million in the same month of 1956; the value landed declined by 34 per cent to \$1.1 million from \$1.6 million in the preceding year.

The January-August landings fell by 7 per cent for the Atlantic Coast to 959.1 million pounds from 1,025.9 million in 1956. The landed value dropped by 9 per cent to \$37.3 million from \$41.1 million in 1956. A low yield of the lobster fishery as well as of the groundfish fisheries in the current year appears to account largely for the decline. Groundfish landings were 6 per cent less than those of 1956 at the end of August, while the lobster catch showed a drop of 16 per cent.

TERRE-NEUVE ENREGISTRE DE LOURDS DEBARQUEMENTS

DE MORUES EN AOUT

Les débarquements de poissons et de crustacés et mollusques de mer, en août, ont atteint 317,214,000 livres, d'une valeur de \$15,669,000. Au regard du même mois, l'an dernier, ces chiffres représentent une augmentation de 15 p. 100 quant au volume et de 8 p. 100 quant à la valeur. La pêche de la morue a donné un haut rendement à Terre-Neuve et celle du saumon sur la côte occidentale a été plus heureuse en août 1957 qu'au cours du même mois, l'an dernier.

Relativement à la période janvier-août, la prise totale a été réduite de 13 p. 100 et s'est établie à 1,325,065,000 livres en 1957, comparativement à 1,519,714,000 en 1956; la valeur débarquée a diminué de 12 p. 100 (\$60,321,000 contre \$68,401,000). En général, toutes les principales pêches, sur les deux côtes, ont figuré à la baisse.

Colombie-Britannique Dans la province du Pacifique, la valeur de tous les débarquements, en août 1957, s'est accrue de 11 p. 100 (\$8,165,000 contre \$7,372,000) par suite, surtout, de changements dans la pêche du saumon. Cette dernière a donné 56,194,000 livres pour une valeur de \$7,443,000, en comparaison de 41,743,000 livres et de \$6,181,000 un an plus tôt; c'était un accroissement de 34 p. 100 en volume et de 20 p. 100 en valeur. Les débarquements de saumon rose et rouge ont été plus considérables qu'un an auparavant, alors que ceux de saumon argenté ont quelque peu décliné.

La prise de flétan s'est pratiquement maintenue au même niveau qu'en 1956, mais sa valeur a fortement diminué. Par suite du bas rendement de la pêche du hareng, les débarquements de toutes les espèces (63,549,000 livres) ont été inférieures de 10 p. 100 à celles du même mois, l'an dernier. Peu de pêcheurs à la seine se sont adonnés à la pêche du hareng en août et, conséquemment, les débarquements ont été légers et ne se sont chiffrés que par 1,329,000 livres (22,394,000 en 1956).

Au cours de janvier-août, les débarquements en 1957 ont baissé de 26 p. 100 sur 1956 (365,927,000 livres contre 493,843,000). Toutefois, il faut observer que la prise, au cours de 1956, avait atteint des chiffres sans pareil. Durant les huit premiers mois, la valeur de la prise en 1957 est tombée de 16 p. 100 au regard de 1956 (\$22,998,000 contre \$27,338,000), reflétant une baisse des recettes provenant des principales pêches, - flétan, hareng et saumon.

Côte de l'Atlantique La prise de poissons et de crustacés et mollusques sur la côte atlantique, en août, a grimpé de 23 p. 100 par rapport à un an plus tôt (253,665,000 livres contre 206,358,000), alors que la valeur débarquée est montée de 4 p. 100 (\$7,504,000 contre \$7,178,000). La morue et le hareng sont les principales espèces qui ont contribué à ce changement. La prise de morues a atteint 156,029,000 livres d'une valeur de \$3,456,000, comparativement à 120,686,000 livres et à \$2,764,000 une année auparavant. Ce sont les pêches de Terre-Neuve qui ont le plus largement contribué à cet accroissement grâce à la continuation inattendue de la pêche au piège qui, dans plusieurs districts, donnait encore des prises considérables à la fin du mois. Ordinairement, la pêche au piège de la morue se termine à la mi-août.

La pêche du hareng a été particulièrement heureuse au Nouveau-Brunswick et en Nouvelle-Ecosse. D'autre part, la prise du homard n'a donné que des résultats médiocres dans le district no 8 qui n'a été ouvert à la pêche que le 10 août. Les débarquements de homard ont diminué de 30 p. 100 (3,761,000 livres contre 5,331,000) et la valeur débarquée a baissé de 34 p. 100 (\$1,087,000 contre \$1,637,000).

Durant janvier-août, les débarquements sur la côte atlantique, en 1957, ont été réduits de 7 p. 100 par rapport à 1956 (959,147,000 livres contre 1,025,871,000). La valeur débarquée a reculé de 9 p. 100 (\$37,317,000 contre \$41,063,000). Le bas rendement, durant la présente année, de la pêche du homard et de celle des poissons de fond semble expliquer en grande partie ce recul. Les débarquements de poissons de fond ont diminué de 6 p. 100 sur la même période de 1956, et ceux de homard ont accusé une réduction de 16 p. 100.

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
