## CANADIAN FISHERIES - OCTOBER, 1954

### CANADA

October landings in the sea-fisheries of Canada amounted to 179,949,000 lb. worth \$6,629,000, higher by 2% and 23% respectively than the 177,006,000 lb. of fish worth \$5,388,000 taken in October, 1953.

In the first ten months of 1954 landings totalled 1,612 million pounds, 11% more than the 1,455 million pounds landed in the comparable period of 1953, while the 1954 value, \$74,020,000, exceeded the 1953 value, \$68,580,000, by 8%.

### ATLANTIC

The Atlantic Coast landings of 67,132,000 lb. for October, 1954, valued at \$2,178,000, were 5% higher in volume and 3% higher in value than the 63,789,000 lb. and \$2,121,000 reported in the same month of last year.

During the ten-month period under review landings amounted to 1,173 million pounds and were valued at \$43,191,000, higher by 6% and 5% respectively than the 1953 figures of 1,103 million pounds and \$40,991,000.

In total, Nova Scotia had a better month than in October, 1953. Rosefish, haddock and cod fisheries showed significant increases. On the other hand hake and cusk, plaice, mackerel and some shellfish showed decreases. For the ten-month period, total landings were higher than in 1953 by 2%, and total value by 3%.

In Quebec, totals both for the month and for the year to date were slightly lower than in 1953, in spite of the increase in the lobster fishery which ran contrary to the general trend.

### PACIFIC

In British Columbia landings of 112,817,000 lb. in October were worth \$4,451,000, and were approximately as great as those of the same month last year. However the total value was up by 36%. Salmon landings valued at \$3,397,000 made up 76% of the total for the province, and as such were largely responsible for the increase in value of the landings.

### STOCKS

Holdings of frozen fish at November 1st totalled 67,290,000 lb. and consisted of 64,651,000 lb. frozen fresh and 2,639,000 lb. frozen smoked.

### EXPORTS

Exports of fish and fish products during the ten months of 1954 to the end of October were valued at \$107,096,000, an amount 12% higher than the comparable figure for 1953. This rise may be attributed chiefly to increased sales of fillets mainly to the U.S.A., and of canned salmon to the United Kingdom.

CANADA

Les débarquements de poisson de mer au Canada ont atteint en octobre 179,- 949,000 livres d'une valeur de \$6,629,000, soit des augmentations respectives de 2 et de 23 p. 100 au regard des chiffres d'octobre 1953 (177,006,000 livres et \$5,- 388,000).

Durant les dix premiers mois de 1954, les débarquements se sont chiffrés par 1,612 millions de livres ou par 11 p. 100 de plus que durant la période correspondante de l'an dernier, 1,455 millions de livres; jusqu'ici, cette année, la valeur (\$74,020,000), surpassé de 8 p. 100 celle (\$68,580,000) de l'an dernier.

ATLANTIQUE

Sur la côte de l'Atlantique, les débarquements (67,132,000 livres) en octobre 1954 ont atteint une valeur de \$2,178,000, augmentation de 5 p. 100 en volume et de 3 p. 100 en valeur au regard du mois correspondant de l'an dernier (63,789,000 livres et \$2,121,000).

Durant les dix mois observés ici, les débarquements se sont chiffrés par 1,173,000 livres et ont atteint une valeur de \$43,191,000, avances respectives de 6 et de 5 p. 100 sur les chiffres de 1953, 1,103,000 livres et \$40,991,000.

Dans l'ensemble, la Nouvelle-Ecosse a connu un meilleur mois qu'en octobre 1953. Les pêches de sébaste, d'aiglefin et de morue ont accusé d'importantes augmentations. D'autre part, la prise de merluche et brosmius, de carrelet, de maquereau et de quelques mollusques a accusé des reculs. Durant les dix mois, les débarquements globaux ont augmenté de 2 p. 100 par rapport à ceux des mêmes mois de 1953, et leur valeur, de 3 p. 100.

Dans le Québec, le total du mois et celui des mois écoulés jusqu'ici ont été inférieurs à ceux de 1953, malgré une augmentation de la prise de homard, laquelle a différé de la tendance générale.

PACIFIQUE

En Colombie-Britannique, les débarquements d'octobre, 112,817,000 livres, ont atteint une valeur de \$4,451,000 et ont été à peu près aussi importants que ceux du même mois l'an dernier. Cependant, la valeur totale a augmenté de 36 p. 100. La valeur du saumon, \$3,397,000, forme 76 p. 100 du total provincial et à ce titre, a été en grande partie comptable de l'augmentation de la valeur des débarquements.

STOCKS

Les stocks de poisson congelé se chiffraient le 1er novembre par 67,290,000 et comprenaient 64,651,000 livres de poisson frais congelé et 2,639,000 livres de poisson fumé.

EXPORTATIONS

Durant les dix mois terminés à la fin d'octobre, les exportations de poisson et produits ont atteint une valeur de \$107,096,000, chiffre supérieur de 12 p. 100 à celui de 1953. Cette augmentation est surtout attribuable à l'avance des ventes de filets, particulièrement aux Etats-Unis, et de saumon en boîtes au Royaume-Uni.
